

What is EFMP?

EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program per Army Regulation 608-75 and Air Force Instruction 40-701 that ensures that the medical and/or educational needs of the Exceptional Family Member (EFM) are considered during assignment coordination. EFMP enrollment may qualify the EFM for additional resources coordinated through Armed Forces Community Service (AFCS) at Lewis Main (Waller Hall) and McChord.



Is EFMP for Children Only?

EFMP is required for all Family members, regardless of age, with a qualifying medical and/or educational need.

Will EFMP

Enrollment Impact My Career?

Enrollment in EFMP does not adversely affect selection for promotions, schools, or assignments.

FACT:

1 in 4 Service members with a rank of E-7 or O-6 is enrolled in EFMP.

Exceptional Family Member Program

Do I qualify for EFMP enrollment?

✓ Medical Enrollment:

Any Family member who requires medical care above the level normally afforded by a Family Medicine provider in an outpatient clinic setting.

Conditions include, but not limited to:

- Serious or chronic medical problems
- Mental health conditions
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Significant developmental delays
- Asthma
- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder

✓ Educational Enrollment:

Any Family member receiving special educational services:

- Eligible for Early Intervention Services and has an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) for children birth-3, or
- Special Education and Educational Accommodations for children ages 3-21
 - ◆ Has an Individualized Educational Program (IEP)

What is the Overseas Screening?

All Family members are required to be screened prior to accompanying the Service member on an overseas assignment to ensure all required medical and educational needs can be accommodated by the host country.

What services are provided by the AFCS staff?

AFCS provides Family support services to include:

- ✓ Information & Referral
- ✓ Advocacy
- ✓ Workshops and Events
- ✓ Crisis Intervention
- ✓ Assistance with Educational Services, Individualized Educational Programs (IEPs) and 504 Plans
- ✓ Respite Care (a brief break for caregivers of EFMs with severe, chronic, medical needs)
- ✓ Systems Navigation (case management services and one-on-one assistance)

The Special Needs Accommodation Process (SNAP)

- Is a multi-disciplinary group of representatives from EFMP, Child, Youth, and School Services (CYSS), and Army Public Health Nursing;
- Determines accommodations and the most appropriate, least restrictive placement for children with special needs; and
- Is a CYSS Parent Central registration requirement for all children with special needs.
- Please call CYSS Parent Central at (253) 966-2977 to initiate CYSS registration.

How do I enroll in EFMP?

The Following Forms are Required for Enrollment:

- ✓ Medical Enrollment – DD Form 2792 completed by the EFM's physician
- ✓ Educational Enrollment – DD Form 2792-1 completed by school staff plus a copy of the IFSP or IEP
