 - *Teachers can be contacted through email.*
 - *Parents may schedule conferences with teachers by calling the school office and making an appointment.*
 - *Parents may check student progress daily by accessing PowerSchool on-line.*

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child’s class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- *School office and teachers share the responsibility for scheduling volunteer opportunities and school visits.*

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

- *Communication will be provided through emails, phone calls and scheduled conferences.*
