<p><b>Creative Writing:</b></p> <p>Write a letter from the perspective of a prisoner in one of the concentration camps. The prisoner might be writing to another prisoner or to someone outside the camps. In the letter, include the circumstances that brought the prisoner to the camp and what the prisoner has endured according to the events in the story.</p>	<p><b>Characterization:</b></p> <p>Create a characterization chart for the major characters in the story. For each character, include the following information:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. A physical description</li><li>2. Character traits (describe his or her personality)</li><li>3. Main role in the story (what did he/she do of importance)</li><li>4.
