

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READING MAKES A DIFFERENCE!




Fifth Grade Summer Reading Requirements

Fifth graders are required to read two novels, this summer, and complete the attached Venn diagram.

- 1. Hatchet by Gary Paulsen
 - All fifth grade students will read *Hatchet*, an award-winning classic novel. Gary Paulsen's survival story, is a page-turning, heart-stopping adventure following a young boy's survival after a plane crash in the Canadian wilderness.
- 2. Wild River by W. Rodman Philbrick
 All fifth grade students will read the novel Wild River. Philbrick
 weaves teamwork and realistic dangers into an exciting
 survival story in which campers are sent down a raging river on a lifeor-death adventure.
- 3. After reading the two novels, students will complete the attached Venn diagram to compare and contrast the books. In addition, students will compare a character from Wild River to the protagonist, in Hatchet.

This assignment is due on the first full day of school. There will be additional assignments to assess the students' understanding of this material.
