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Wordless picture books are important additions to your child's library. In the absence of words, your child will be ompelled to ask questions, make predictions, and read characters' facial expressions and body language to gain meaning. Wordless books provide the opportunity to increase vocabulary as well as to encourage writing.

Owl Bat Bat Owl by Marie Louise Fitzpatrick

A mother owl and her three little owlets live happily on their branch. That is, until the bat family moves in.

The Lion and the Mouse by Jerry Pinkney

In award-winning artist Jerry Pinkney's wordless adaptation of one of Aesop's most beloved fables, an unlikely pair learn that no act of kindness is ever wasted.

Little Bird by Germano Zullo

A man drives his truck up to a cliff's edge. Unable to go any further, he opens the back door of his truck and a flock of birds flies out, but, as the man soon discovers, a small timid bird remains.


Fly by Mark Teague


