

TIPS WHILE READING WITH YOUR CHILD:

- When they are stuck on a word, before telling them what it is, count to 10 silently give them a chance to focus on the word, redirect them to look at the word and then tell them to sound it out. You can also point out the beginning sound and help them sound the part where they are stuck.
- There are going to be words they have not seen before. This is great because that is how they will grow their vocabulary and list of words they know!
- Make a Reading Routine Set aside a specific time each day to dedicate to reading. By making it a priority, you relay the message that reading is important.
