






### Kilimanjaro, Tanzania

A 7-day service trip with in-depth community insight and a chance to visit two of the best game parks in east Africa - Ngorongoro Crater and Lake Manyara National Park.

# TANZANIA











### Day 1 - Welcome to Tanzania!

Depending on arrival times, students will travel to Mshiri where we work closely with the local schools nestled in the foothills of Mt. Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest mountain. We carefully coordinate our projects focused on a mix of teaching, sport, and renovation work (in conjunction with the local students). Students will have a unique opportunity to form friendships with the local kids, participate in daily life, and experience Tanzanian culture.

We camp near Marangu for the night where the truck crew shows us how to pitch our tents and prepare the camp.

### <u>Days 2 - 3: Service</u>

The next few days students will spend at a local school in Mshiri working on community development projects. Students will receive community hours for their efforts.

### Day 4: Community Insight

We leave Mshiri and drive to Tengeru on the outskirts of Arusha where we take a guided walk through the village to witness the day-to-day life of the people, long established as crop-growers on the fertile slopes of Kilimanjaro. The visit will include traditional meals, a coffee farm visit including hands on practical lessons on roasting, grinding, and brewing. We spend the night at Arusha below Mt Meru.







### Day 5: Community Insight

Students will leave Arusha and head west across the Great Rift Valley towards Mto Wa Mbu, where we tour the village with a local guide. We will visit one or two homes, learn about the agricultural practices. A traditional lunch will be served at the village in one of the family homes, and the students will be able to sample a variety of different types of local food and see how they are prepared. We will also be passing through the lands of the Maasai where we often see them tending to their cattle.

Students continue on their scenic journey to Ngorongoro Crater, where they camp on the rim of the crater for the night with magnificent views down into the caldera.

### <u>Day 6: Safari (game drive)</u>

Today, students spend the day in the Ngorongoro Crater in smaller four-wheel drive vehicles accompanied by a local guide. There is excellent game-viewing here as the caldera has about 30,000 resident animals. The photographic opportunities are unrivaled, and this is one of the best places to see the endangered black rhino. We then descend the slopes of the volcanic massif to Mtu Wa Mbu (Twiga Camp) where we spend the night.

### <u>Day 7: Departure & Morning Safari (if time permits)</u>

This morning we drive to Lake Manyara National Park for a game drive. This park has a spectacular concentration of animals for such a small park and the reserve is best known for its tree-climbing lions, but it also contains large numbers of elephant, hippo, buffalo, and impala as well as a wide variety of birdlife.

In the afternoon we head back towards Arusha to check-in for the flight home from Kilimanjaro International Airport.





## Paris, France Grades 10-12 7 days, 6 nights

### Day 1: Arrival

Welcome to Paris! Starting with a climb of the Arc de Triomphe for spectacular views over the city that will be our home for the next few days. Next, we will continue down the Champs Élysées to Place de la Concorde and see the Place Vendôme and Jardin de Tuileries.

### <u>Day 2: Rungis, Boat and Louvre</u>

Today we visit the Rungis wholesale market, the largest fresh foods market in the world, which employs 15,000 people and serves 18 million people a year. Afterwards, we relax on a guided boat tour of the Seine, taking us from Île de la Cité up to the foot of the Eiffel Tower, and back around Île St Louis before returning.

In the afternoon we visit to the famous Louvre Museum, home of Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa, the Venus de Milo, and thousands of other works of art. The international collections on display have been assembled by French governments over the last 5 centuries and include important works of art from all over the world.

### Day 3: La Caverne, Cooking Class, and Père Lachaise

This morning we explore La Caverne – the largest underground organic farm in Paris. As restaurants and their clients demand higher eco-responsibility, we look at the way this surreal project takes it to the next level. With its own assembly line and recycling circuits, this has become the go-to place for high-end restaurants to source their shiitake mushrooms, fresh chicory, and other essentials while sticking to the highest standards for the environment.

In the afternoon we stroll through the Père Lachaise cemetery, where we can reflect on the lives of a vast range of notable people, including Oscar Wilde, Jim Morrison, Marcel Proust, Frédéric Chopin and Édith Piaf. Finally, we experience a culinary treat as we take a French cooking class. Top local chefs will guide us through the ingredients, recipes, and techniques to create beautiful French cuisine, which we of course then get to enjoy.







### Day 4: The Chateau de Versailles and Perfume Museum

Today we go out to the enormous Château de Versailles, built in the mid-17th century by Louis XIV, the Sun King, and serving as the country's political capital and seat of the royal court from 1682 until 1789. Learn what happened in the Hall of Mirrors and explore the King's and Queen's apartments before a stroll through the magnificent gardens.

When we get back into Paris we take the opportunity to visit the Musées du Parfum. As well as learning about the history of perfume and how it is made, this is a wonderful place to find that gift for family back home.

### Day 5: Baking, Parkour, and Eiffel Tower

A truly French experience and a sweet treat for us all this morning as we learn to make macarons. And of course, we keep everything we make, but we bet most of it doesn't last long!

In the afternoon we try out the fast-growing sport of Parkour. Paris is widely regarded as the birthplace of this high-paced, adrenaline-fueled sport. We learn from the best, as some of the city's top practitioners come to teach us some moves. We start slowly and then build up as we bound over natural and manmade obstacles alongside the river.

After dinner we head to the second level of the Eiffel Tower for incredible night time views over the city, the memories of which will last a lifetime.





## Paris, France Grades 10-12 7 days, 6 nights

### Day 6: Catacombs, Cordon Bleu Cookery School

In the morning we visit the Catacombs where around the start of the 19th Century the bones of millions of Parisians where exhumed from overflowing cemeteries and moved to the tunnels of three disused quarries. During WW2 these tunnels where also used by the French Résistance as headquarters.

In the afternoon we have a tour of the Cordon Bleu Cookery school. The teachers at this prestigious school show us around, giving us a taste of what life is like there for the students who come from all over the world to study.

#### Day 7 Departure for Hong Kong

This day's activities will vary depending on departure time back to Hong Kong.

### Cambodia

A 7-day trip including thought provoking service and fascinating community insight, as well as the chance to explore ancient temples and learn new skills.

### <u>Day 1: Arrival in Siem Reap</u>

Welcome to Cambodia! We head from the airport to see the stunning Ta Prohm Temple, made famous to a larger audience in the Tomb Raider movies. Ta Prohm is overrun with massive trees, their roots intertwined with the temple stones almost as if they are frozen in battle. Here we also have an introduction to the week ahead, meet the Indago team, and learn a few Khmer words and phrases.

### Day 2-4: Service

While Siem Reap may seem to be flourishing to a tourist on a short stay, the province is in fact one of the three poorest in Cambodia. We will work in the village of Kompheim, which lies just outside of Siem Reap town and is an area of extreme poverty. A recurrent theme of individual projects will be:

» Leaving a tangible change. Many of our Cambodian projects are based around building important structures (such as school classrooms and training workshops) from plastic bottles and dry plastic waste from around the village.

»Teaching in the school. Our partners, HUSK, run several English language classes every week throughout the year in order to supplement the local students' education, providing them with greater employment opportunities in later life. We will go into the school to teach English to the local students.







### Day 5: Cycling & Circus Skills

We start off the day with a cycling adventure. The bike ride brings us to a hidden temple in the forest where we stop for lunch and games, as well as a briefing from our guide. In the afternoon we have a unique opportunity for an authentic Cambodian experience. The students take part in a circus skills workshop with local Cambodian artists. This is linked to an NGO working to awaken the arts in Cambodia and is an absolute treat to be involved with. After a traditional Khmer dinner we then get to see the circus in action!

On the way home we have a chance to visit Siem Reap's famous night market, where we can haggle for the perfect souvenir, or simply relax with a Khmer style foot massage.

### Day 6: Temples and Great Race

Today we visit the staggering Angkor Wat. The jewel of the Khmer Empire was built over 900 years ago and remains the largest religious monument ever built. A guided tour through the incredible complex will bring Angkor to life. Students will learn about how the incredible temple was constructed, the people who lived around it, and the stories of the gods and demons that adorn its walls. We also explore the amazing city of Angkor Thom. The city is surrounded by walls and five separate gates. We enter through the south gate guarded by angels and demons. Within the city is the amazing Bayon temple adorned with smiling faces, the Terrace of the Leper King and Elephant Terrace. We explore these sites allowing students to learn more about Cambodia's fascinating history.

After lunch we take a completely different approach to learning about Angkor culture with the Angkor Great Race. This team challenge is conducted in Siem Reap and the surrounding villages. Teams undertake tasks, both physical and mental, while navigating their way around and learning about the incredible history and culture of the region on their way. This race is a memorable highlight of every trip! We finish the trip in style with a group barbecue. This gives us an opportunity to reflect together on an amazing week.







Grades 10-12 7 days, 6 nights

### Day 7: Giving Alms & Departure

We have an early start this morning, but nobody will want to miss the journey to a local rural village to give alms as saffron monks wander through the village. This daybreak Buddhist ritual dates back thousands of years and is incredibly important in Khmer culture. An alms gift of food and water is part of ancient belief system of earning merit and honouring the deceased. We take part in the ceremony with appropriately prepared gifts. Other activities today will depend on departure time.

## Chiang Mai, Thailand

A 6-day trip to beautiful northern Thailand to experience action adventure and community service in a local village.















## Thailand Grades 7-9 6 days, 5 nights

### Day 1: Welcome to Thailand!

Sawatdee and welcome to Thailand! Arrive at Chiang Mai International Airport (CNX) where your journey in Thailand will begin. From the airport you will get dinner, head to the hotel, and have an orientation with your program leaders to get a better idea of what you will be doing this week. Overnight: Chiang Mai

### <u>Day 2: Chiang Dao Cave, Bikes, and Hot Springs Adventure</u>

Head up to Chiang Dao, just about one and a half hours north of Chiang Mai. The first stop will be the famous and well-traveled Chiang Dao Cave, located at the foot of the mountain. With a local guide, descend into the darkness where only the light from the handheld lanterns pierces the complete darkness. This sacred cave is dotted with Buddhist and animist shrines, and alternated between large caverns and small tunnels. Emerging from the cave the group will don helmets for an afternoon bicycle tour through the beautiful countryside and swim in natural hot springs. Enjoy a traditional Kan Tok dinner and music show.

Overnight: Chiang Dao

### <u>Day 3: Village Infrastructure Service</u>

Enjoy a hearty breakfast at the Treehouse and then head to the local school to work on an ongoing infrastructure project. Working side by side with staff and locals, you will gain pride as you accomplish construction goals for the day and enjoy getting to know those around you even more closely. After wrapping up for the day, you can take time in the afternoon to play soccer with the locals, practice your new Thai vocabulary with our staff and villagers, or find a quiet place to write in your journal. Join your group for post-service debriefs in the evening, discussing what you experienced and learned through hands-on work in the community. Overnight: Chiang Dao







### Day 4: Classroom Service and Trekking

Start the morning in small groups preparing a simple English enrichment lesson plan with your teachers and program leaders. Once you have worked out your learning objectives and games, you will head into the classroom to help the students with basic English activities. After lunch, start your hike in the nearby mountains, enjoying amazing views of the surrounding peaks. Along the way, our seasoned staff will explain the different plants and trees of the jungle as well as the many uses in traditional Thai medicine and cooking. After a 3 hour hike through beautiful mountains and forest, you will arrive back at the Treehouse Lodge where you can rest and relax for the evening. Overnight: Chiang Dao

### Day 5: Mae Dtaeng River Rafting

After breakfast, say goodbye to the Chiang Dao and make your way back to Chiang Mai, but not before stopping along the Mae Taeng River for a white water rafting adventure. This is the perfect way to experience Thailand's Riparian ecosystems as these waterways are home to many endemic species of birds, fish and reptiles. The tranquil stretches of river are interspersed with exciting rapids and you are guaranteed to get a little wet and have a lot of fun. In the evening you will head to Chiang Mai's famous Night Bazaar for a final night extravaganza. Explore the many alleys and side streets of this bustling market, the perfect place to get souvenirs for all of your friends and family back home.

Overnight: Chiang Mai







### Day 6: Head Home

The past week has flown and you will have a wealth of incredible experiences to reflect on as you journey home. After such an amazing trip through the beautiful forests and meeting so many wonderful and unique people along the way, it will be hard to say goodbye, but don't worry, you can always come back and visit us again in the "Land of Smiles"!



### <u>Day 2: Nature Adventure</u>

After breakfast we will head to the karsts for a Via Ferrata experience. Students will have the unique opportunity to navigate along the rock wall. After lunch, we will continue our nature adventure by exploring caves. Finally, we will end the day with dinner and a talent show.

### <u>Day 3: Culture and Adventure</u>

Today's activities start with a traditional tea workshop. Students will get to pick, brew, and taste local teas. After lunch we will test our rock climbing skills through an abseiling lesson. After dinner we will enjoy time together with some night games.

### <u>Day 4: Culture and Adventure</u>

Today we will participate in a traditional fan painting activity. Students will learn from a local artisan how to construct folding fans and then use traditional painting styles to decorate. Before lunch, students will also take part in a scavenger hunt.

After lunch it is time for some more adventure, this time on the water with group kayaking along the beautiful Yulong river. After dinner, we will enjoy a cozy campfire and sharing session.

### <u>Day 1: Travel and Street Banquet</u>

Nov 4 - 8

Travel by bullet train from Hong Kong to Sanjiang. Meet the Peninsula staff and hotel check-in. Enjoy some teambuilding activities before a traditional Dong village street banquet, dinner, and a night walk.

### Day 2: Treasure Hunt and Dong Cultural Activities

After breakfast we will participate in a village treasure hunt. After lunch, we will enjoy an introduction to Dong culture and art through traditional herb-dye cloth making. Later we will experience local sticky rice and ginger tea (Chinese coffee) making experience.

After dinner, we will take part in a traditional Dong architecture discovery workshop.

### Day 3: Architecture and Music

First we will participate in a guided Dong wooden structured landmark visit to explore architecture and community relationships. After lunch, explore the mini drum tower and wind-rain bridge building.

After dinner, we will have the opportunity to play our own traditional instruments and learn more about the musical artform.

### <u>Day 4: Sanjiang Community Life</u>

After breakfast we will learn about impact of tourism on local life, and learn how to carry out sustainable goals. After lunch, experience the local water source observation and traditional solution know-how. We will end the day with a talent show and sharing session.
