PRESENTATIONS

A. Lakewood High School

Mr. Kevin Krier, Lakewood High School Principal, provided an update on the Lakewood High School course offerings book for the 2023-2024 school year. He also introduced two (2) High School Students who participated in the Rotary Experience during January, which included attending weekly Rotary meetings. Mr. Storm Negele and Ms. Sydney Kane presented their Rotary Experience which included discussing the Rotary values and the speakers from each of the weekly meetings. They both commented they were grateful for the opportunity and experience.

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B. Teaching and Learning Update

Ms. Patti Pickering, Director of Teaching and Learning, provided an update of the current and future Engineering Pathway. She discussed the goals of this pathway and the courses that are offered and to be offered. She also talked about Community partners and the program cost and funding sources.

Ms. Misner asked if the courses are being taught in the Innovation Center. Ms. Pickering commented that yes they are.

Mr. Lohr asked if there was any value to asking local manufactures for old equipment donations versus purchasing new equipment. Ms. Pickering commented that will be considered as the program moves forward.

C. Lakewood Schools Update

Dr. Mark Gleichauf, Superintendent, provided the following updates:

- Reviewed the two contracts on the agenda. The purchase of the L810 Freezer from Polar King International for the JIS-B (Lakewood Elementary) kitchen. The District received two proposals on a freezer and this one was the lowest price. The freezer will be detached from the building, making it portable to another location in the future. There is also a contract for Parnell & Associates for an additional 35 parking spots at the JIS building. The District had a Request for Proposal on this and received proposals from seven (7) vendors. Parnell & Associates provided the best plan layout at the lowest price.

Ms. Misner asked if we are saving money by making the freezer portable. Dr. Gleichauf commented that this freezer is a single stage exterior freezer. So this unit is cheaper. This is different from what was discussed earlier on, with a cooler/freezer combination.

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**APPROVE THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION SELECTING PARNELL & ASSOCIATES INC. FOR THE ADDITIONAL PARKING SPOTS PROJECT ON THE JACKSON SCHOOL CAMPUS AND AUTHORIZING THE AGREEMENT WITH THE CONTRACTOR
RES. NO. 071-23**

The Superintendent recommends Parnell & Associates, Inc. (“Parnell”) as the contractor who is in the best interest of the Lakewood Local School District Board of Education (the “Board”) for the Additional Parking Spots Project (the “Project”) and requests authority to negotiate an agreement with Parnell based upon its proposal and to execute the agreement at the satisfactory conclusion of negotiations.

Rationale:

1. The Project is not subject to the bidding statute, R.C. 3313.46, because the scope of the Project falls outside the parameters of that statute, as it is not a “school building” as defined in Ohio Administrative Code Section 4101:1-2-01.
2. The District solicited proposals through a competitive proposal process.
3. The Superintendent believes that Parnell’s proposal is appropriately competitive and in the best interest of the Board.
4. The Superintendent recommends that the Board select Parnell as the contractor who is in the best interest of the Board for the Project.
5. The Superintendent requests authority to negotiate an agreement with Parnell for the Project and to execute the agreement at the satisfactory conclusion of negotiations in an amount not to exceed \$61,423.00 (“Project Value”).
6. Additionally, the Superintendent requests authority to enter into change orders on behalf of the Board in a total amount not to exceed 10% of the Project Value; change orders in excess of that amount will be brought to the Board for its approval.

The Lakewood Local School District Board of Education resolves as follows:

1. Based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, the Board selects Parnell as the contractor who is in the best interest of the Board for the Project.
2. The Board authorizes the Superintendent to work with other administrators and legal counsel to negotiate an agreement with Parnell for the Project, based upon Parnell’s proposal, and to execute the agreement at the satisfactory conclusion of the negotiations in an amount not to exceed \$61,423.00.
3. The Board further authorizes the Superintendent and Treasurer to sign change orders related to the Project in a total amount not to exceed 10% of the Project Value; should a change order exceed this amount individually or as the aggregate of change orders for the

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work, the change order will be brought to the Board for approval prior to the work being performed.
