



ABOUT FORDHAM PREPARATORY SCHOOL

Fordham Preparatory School is an all-male, Jesuit Catholic high school, located in The Bronx, NY. Our commitment to education is shaped by the spirituality and pedagogical tradition of the Society of Jesus, founded in 1540 by St. Ignatius Loyola. Fordham Prep stresses the development of excellence in the whole person: intellectual, religious, social, emotional, and physical. Today, our educational apostolate is strengthened by our affiliation with the local, national and international networks of Jesuit secondary schools.

At the heart of Jesuit education is the rigorous study of the humanities and the sciences, reflecting the conviction that the study of great ideas is inextricably linked to the formation of character. Recently upgraded, Murphy field boasts the latest state-of-the-art artificial turf and remains lighted at night for team play and practice.



FITNESS CENTER

New Fitness and Wellness Center (opening Sept. 2023). The Prep is creating a new Fitness and Wellness Center. The renovation and expansion of the Intramural Gym will create a best-in-class 8,070 square foot facility that reflects the Prep's commitment to health, wellness and fraternity. The proposed renovated gym will include state-of-the-art systems and stations designed to enhance physical performance, health and overall wellness. In addition, a new strength/

conditioning coach will be hired to guide students through conditioning exercises and proper use of the equipment.



ATHLETIC FACILITIES



DONNIE WALSH COURT

Hardwood court used by basketball, volleyball, and wrestling teams. Facility is also used for intramurals sports and Physical Ed classes.



INTRAMURAL GYMNASIUM

Facility used by Phys Ed classes, school intramural program and wrestling team. Court also used by baseball teams as a hitting facility with mounds and batting cage available.



LOMBARDI CENTER POOL

The 38-meter and 25+yard pool 4 x 13 feet in depth), has 8 lanes and adjustable bulk-heads for competition by either meters or yards. Diving facilities include: two, three-meter diving boards and two, one-meter diving boards, and a trampoline with an overhead spotting rig. The pool features a dry land exercise deck area, a 13 yard diving well that allows room to warm up, an eight-lane scoreboard with a Colorado Timing system, and seating for 1,000.



2023 VARSITY COACHES



VARSITY HEAD COACH ROB COUGHLIN P'15

Coach Coughlin grew up in Manhasset, New York, where he played lacrosse at Saint Mary's High School and was a member of the 1980 Long Island Catholic League Lacrosse Champions. After high school, he went on to play midfield at Princeton University between 1981-1984. After college he played for several years for the New York Athletic Club and also ran a youth program in Manhattan. Coach Coughlin is a member of the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame and sits on the board of CityLax and Friends of Princeton Lacrosse.

Robert is the father of triplets, daughter Claire and sons Eamon '15 and Patrick '15, both of whom played lacrosse at the Prep. Coach Coughlin is most excited to coach student-athletes at a Jesuit institution with a rich tradition of both academic and athletic excellence.



DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR JOE SHANAGAN

In college Coach Shanagan was a three year starter and team captain at defense for the University of Pennsylvania and was named the Quakers' Most Value Player his junior year. During his high school career at Lynbrook, his team won the 2000 state title and two section championships. Coach Shanagan previously coached for four years at Lynbrook HS on Long Island. Coach Shanagan currently is a Lieutenant for the FDNY at Engine 79 in the Bronx.



OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR CONNOR BROWN '09

A native of Pleasantville, at the Prep Coach Brown was a three year varsity letter-winner and was named team captain, as well as team MVP, during both his junior and senior seasons. Throughout his playing career, he was named All-Conference Second Team once, All-Conference First Team and All-Metro 2x as well as All-League 3x. He also was selected to the 20-man roster for the 2008 Hudson Valley Empire State Games where his team placed 3rd, earning a bronze medal. Coach Brown finished his Fordham Prep lacrosse career with a total of 198 points including 110 goals and 88 assists. His 198 points were ranked 4th all-time in the

program's history when he was inducted.

After Fordham Prep, he went on to play for Colgate University. During his Junior campaign in 2012, he helped the Raiders earn an at large bid to the NCAA tournament, defeating nationally ranked #1 UMass in the first round before ultimately falling to Duke in the NCAA Quarterfinals. Colgate finished that season ranked 8th nationally. Cooach Brown returned to the Prep in 2022 as the Assistant Dean of Students and also coaches the JV football team.





ASSISTANT VARSITY COACH JAY RABINOWITZ

Coach Rabinowitz is entering his ninth season as a varsity assistant. He was Defensive Coordinator when the Prep won its first AA State Championship in 2016 and NYC AA Championship in 2018. Coach Rabinowitz was previously the head varsity boys lacrosse coach at Harrison HS (NY) from 2010 to 2014, where he appeared in the sectional finals and quarterfinals each of the four seasons. Before his time at Harrison, he was the head varsity lacrosse coach at Roslyn HS (NY) from 2007 to 2010. Coach Rabinowitz played college lacrosse at New Hampshire and was named first team All-New England in 1994 and 1996. He then became Lehigh University's Defensive Coordinator in 1997 and won a Patriot League Championship in 1999.

He was raised on Long Island and played at North Shore High School, where he was a four year varsity starter. Coach Rabinowitz currently works for the NYC Dept. Of Education as a Learning Specialist for high school

2023 JUNIOR VARSITY COACHES



JUNIOR VARSITY HEAD COACH SEANN FARRELL

Coach Farrell comes to Fordham Prep from Seton Hall Prep in New Jersey, where he coached the Freshmen Lacrosse team and was an assistant coach on the Varsity Football team. He is currently coaching the Freshmen Football team at the Prep. Coach Farrell played football and lacrosse at New Jersey power Delbarton HS before heading to play football at Fordham University as a 2005 graduate.



JUNIOR VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH ALEX ULRICH

Coach Ulrich played collegiately at Gettysburg College where he was an All-American, All-Centennial Conference, and team Captain his senior year. He helped lead the Bullets to three top 10 national rankings in 2019, 2020, and 2021. A native of Annapolis, MD, Coach Ulrich was a three time letterman at St. Mary's High School, winning the MIAA Championship in 2015.



35 YEARS OF FORDHAM PREP LACROSSE






Fordham Preparatory School has a very proud tradition when it comes to lacrosse. Started in 1989, Fordham Prep's program has always been one of the top lacrosse programs in the Tri-State area.



In 1993, the Rams won their first city championship going 19-0. That season, the Single Season Team Wins record was set (19).





From 1993 to 2003, the Rams would roll and win an impressive 11 straight city championships. Coach Steve Traendly (1991-2006) set the Career Coacing Wins record going 202-42, .828% Win Pct.



Connor Nugent '06 holds the Career Records for Goals (133), Assists (129) & Points (262). Nugent also holds the Single Season Record for Goals (63). Geoff DeSoye '06 holds the Single Season Records for Assists (54) & Points (108).





SCOTT ALBERI '94 (2022)

HOF Class of 2022. A native of Yonkers, Scott was an All-American, First Team All-League, team Most Valuable Player, and Captain his senior year, as well as First Team All-League his junior year. He finished his career with 155 points (50G, 105A), graduating as the program's all time assists leader and second in career points. At induction he was program's #3 in career assists and #9 in career points. Scott led the Rams to a 38 - 1 record over his junior and senior seasons and was a member of the NYC Empire States Games team. He continued his playing career at Fairfield Jniversity.

BEN ANDREYCAK '12 (2018)

HOF Class of 2018. A native of Pleasantville, Ben was a two time All-American during his senior and junior years while also being awarded the team MVP his senior year. He was named the New York Post's Player of the Year his junior year and finished his Fordham Prep career with 191 points (109G, 82A). Ben continued his success at Tufts University where he won two national championships and four NESCAC titles. He was first team All-American, Academic All-American, first team All-NESCAC, and team captain his senior year.

CONNOR BROWN '09 (2020)

HOF Class of 2020. A native of Pleasantville, Connor was a three year varsity letter-winner and was named team captain, as well as team MVP, during both his junior and senior seasons. Named All-Conference Second Team 1x, All-Conference First Team and All-Metro 2x as well as All-League 3x. Connor finished his Fordham Prep lacrosse career with a total of 198 PTS (110 G, 88 A) (4th all-time). After Fordham Prep, he went on to play for Colgate University. During his Junior campaign in 2012, he helped the Raiders defeat nationally ranked #1 UMASS in the first round before ultimately falling to Duke in the NCAA Quarterfinals.



DANIEL CUNNIFFE '93 (2019)

HOF Class of 2019. A native of Waccabuc, Dan was a three year member of the varsity team, serving as captain both his junior and senior years. He was team MVP ('92,'93), named first team All-Westchester County ('93), All-League ('92,'93), and was a member of the 1992 NYC Empire State Games team. As a senior, Dan led the team in points (43G/34A), helping the team complete its first ever undefeated season (19-0) and win its first ever City Championship. After Fordham Prep, Dan went on to play football at Georgetown. He was named captain during his senior year and was part of a Georgetown defensive squad that led all Division 1-AA schools in total defense.



GEOFFREY DeSOYE '06 (2018)







STEPHEN DeVOE '01 (2018)

CHRISTOPHER DUFFY '96 (2017)



THOMAS GALLIVAN '97 (2020)




PAUL KOECHELER '98 (2016)



HOF Class of 2019. A native of Yonkers, Christopher was a four-year varsity letter winner, two-time All-American, and team captain his junior and senior years. He was a part of the 2006 CHSAA City Championship team. He was named All-Conference 2nd Team, 3x All-Conference 1st Team, 3x All-Metro First Team, CHSAA Goalie of the Year in 2009, Metro Goalie of the Year in 2008 and 2009. Christopher finished his career with over 700 saves and a 70% save percentage. After Fordham Prep, Christopher continued his lacrosse career at St. Joseph's University where he served as team captain his senior year.

MICHAEL MURRAY '01 (2022)

HOF Class of 2022. A native of Larchmont, Michael was selected First Team All-League his junior and senior years. As a senior he served as team Captain and was voted to All-Metro and team Most Valuable Player. Michael was the Captain of the 2000 NYC Empire State Games team and helped the Prep win four straight CHSAA 'AA' championships before continuing his playing career at Middlebury College. At Middlebury he played in three national championship games, winning a national title in 2002. Michael won four NESCAC titles while at Middlebury and was named First Team All-NESCAC, and team Captain his senior year.

CONNOR NUGENT '06 (2016)

HOF Class of 2016. A native of White Plains, Connor was a four year varsity starter who also received first team All-League recognition four times. A three time team Most Valuable Player award winner, he also was a team Captain his junior and senior year. Connor finished his Fordham Prep career as the program leader in points, goals, and assists (262P, 133G, 129A).


COACH STEVE TRAENDLY (2015)



He finished his tenure at Fordham Prep as the program's All Time Winningest Coach going 202-42 with a .828 Winning Percentage.



COACH LEN DeLUCIA (2023)

HOF Class of 2023. A longtime supporter of Fordham Prep and the lacrosse program, both on the field and off. As Head Coach, Len led the Rams to 72 victories (second all time) and was instrumental in taking the program to the next level through increasing the breadth and competitiveness of the team's schedule. He laid the foundation for Prep teams that became nationally ranked and a regional power on the east coast. He was a CHSAA Coach of the Year, won two CHSAA Championships, and coached a myriad of All-Americans and CHSAA Players of the Year.
