

Advanced Learning Opportunities for 622 High School Students

High school students in District 622 can develop their knowledge and skills in areas where they show strength and interest, all while potentially earning college credits.

Advanced Placement (AP) courses allow students to take college-level courses and exams while they are still in high school. In May, students may take an exam to earn college credit without leaving their high school.

Articulated courses allow juniors and seniors to enroll in specific Business, Family, and Consumer Sciences (FACS) and Technology courses and earn college credit. Upon graduation, students who enroll at Century College will receive credit for the courses completed while attending 622 schools.

College in the Schools (CIS) is a University of Minnesota (U of MN) program that offers university courses in high schools. Students learn at the pace of a university course. Grades are recorded on an official U of MN transcript, which many colleges and universities across the U.S. will recognize.



Concurrent enrollment courses are college-level courses taught by our teachers and offered in partnership with a college or university. Students earn both high school and college credits from the partnering school.

Century College offers several options for concurrent enrollment with 622.

Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) allow 10th-12th grade students to earn both high school and college credit through successfully completing courses on the campus of participating postsecondary institutions. Some courses are offered online. Students can participate on a full- or part-time basis and can still participate in high school activities and athletics.

916 Career and Tech Center (CTE) offers the opportunity for students to take career and skill-based classes for college credit at Century College. Courses include health sciences, engineering, arts, and more. 622 provides buses for students to and from the CTE program.

As spring approaches, many high school seniors are preparing to transition to higher learning and the workforce, and many middle school students are preparing to enter high school in the fall. District 622 offers several opportunities for high school students to ready themselves for college, and earn college credit.

Students can earn college credit both on the campus of a postsecondary institution, or without ever stepping foot out of their high school through various programs. College in the Schools (CIS) even provides students with an official University of Minnesota transcript. You can read more about our advanced learning opportunities on the left.

From athletics, to the arts, to academic clubs, there is no shortage of opportunities for students regardless of their interests. 622 Online students are also able to participate in activities at their home high school if they live in the district.

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High School Activities and Athletics Achievements

Tartan Business Professionals of America (BPA): This year, 22 Tartan students qualified for the BPA State competition in 26 different events.

North DECA: Ten students advanced to the state competition held in early March, with several advancing in more than one event. Over 600 students from DECA District 2 participated.

Tartan DECA: Tartan's DECA Store achieved Gold Level Re-Certification and will be recognized during DECA's International Career Development Conference.

North Band and Choir: 16 band students and 10 choir students participated in the All Conference concerts.

Tartan Band and Choir: 13 band students and 7 choir students participated in the All Conference concerts.

Tartan Wrestling: Allen Pearson placed 2nd in Section 4AAA and competed at State.

North Swimming & Diving: Willy Coborn was named Section 4AA Swimmer of the Year and competed at State. Polar swimmers earned a Gold academic distinction with a team GPA of 3.88.

Tartan Swimming & Diving: Titan swimmers earned a Gold academic distinction with a team GPA of 3.78. Boys coach Marissa Metzger was named section coach of the year.

North Boys' Volleyball: This year, boys' volleyball was added as a club sport, and will become an MSHSL varstiy sport in the coming years.

Fusion Drumline: Fusion is made up of students from both middle and both high schools. This year they have placed first in two competitions.
