The Commencement Ceremony for the Class of 2023 will be held at the PPL Center on Tuesday, June 6, at 7 PM. Seniors should arrive at the PPL Center by 5:45 PM and enter at the loading dock on Linden Street between 7th and 8th Streets. Parents will not be permitted to enter at this gate. Parents should utilize the WFMZ gate (7th and Hamilton), LVHN gate (8th and Hamilton), or Northwest gate (8th and Linden). Attendees can find available parking for \$6 at several locations: Allentown Transportation Deck (N. 6th and Linden), Community Deck (13 South 6th), Government Deck (4th and Hamilton), The Spiral Deck (800 Block of W. Linden), 9th and Walnut Deck (9th and Walnut), and the Strata Deck (39 N. 6th).

At Commencement Practice, each graduate will be provided with six tickets for guests and any extra tickets that were previously requested. If your student has not ordered a cap and gown for graduation, please call Mrs. Schutter, Main Office Administrative Assistant at 610-351-5600, x73664. You must have a cap and gown to participate in Commencement.

All seniors intending on participating in our Commencement Ceremony MUST be at Commencement Practice on Tuesday, June 6, 2023, at 8:30 AM at the PPL Center. Students are permitted to use their own means of transportation to Commencement Practice but will need to pay for parking. If utilizing their own transportation, please have seniors arrive promptly and enter at the loading dock. Shuttle buses will be provided for students needing transportation to Commencement Practice. The shuttle buses will depart from Parkland High School's front circle at 7:55 AM. Shuttle buses will return students to the high school after practice, but students must have their own transportation home.

All graduation requirements must be fulfilled to participate in the Commencement Ceremony. National Honor Society stoles will also be handed out at Commencement Practice to those students fulfilling all NHS requirements. Commencement Practice is expected to last until approximately 12 PM.

Commencement is a formal ceremony and the Parkland School District will be treating this evening with the respect and dignity it deserves. This is the final moment of your student's high school education, so we want each student to dress their best. Appropriate attire for this event could include: dress slacks, a dress shirt and tie, dresses, skirts, and appropriate footwear. Sunglasses or decorated caps and gowns will not be permitted. If you are not dressed appropriately as noted above, you will not participate in Commencement. PPL did share a list of banned items for the event which includes the following: balloons, aerosol cans, noise making devices, and beach balls.

In preparation for the evening of graduation, we are sharing a list of restaurants and cafes in Downtown Allentown. PPL concessions will be open but we know it will be crowded so we are advertising some local options. Keep in mind you want to arrive downtown early. Several restaurants have deals and discounts available for graduation participants so if you are planning on enjoying dinner before the event, remember to beat the crowds. 

Online registration for the 2023 - 2024 SAT tests will be available throughout the summer months at www.sat.org/register. August 26 and October 7 are the first two testing dates of the school year.



The PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test) will be administered next fall to sophomores and juniors on Saturday, October 14, 2023 at Parkland High School. The College Board allows for this test to be administered only once every school year. Please mark this date on your calendar for future reference. Information about the PSAT can be found on www.collegeboard.com/psat. Registration for the PSAT will take place at the start of the 2023 - 2024 school year. If you have not completed the lessons in Xello, you received an *Unsatisfactory* for the Career Explorations course. You need to complete this course to graduate. Please spend time over the summer to complete the course.

Career Explorations Course

The Career Explorations program has replaced the Graduation Project requirement for students starting with the Class of 2017. The purpose of this course is to teach students how to match personal needs and expectations with satisfying career options.

In Career Explorations, students will learn:

- *Self-assessment skills
- *To research major and career alternatives
- *To make decisions based upon sound factual information
- *To utilize a variety of resources

Students will need to complete an online course and digital portfolio using tools in Xello. They can access Xello through the Clever App. This work will mostly be done on the student's own time, however students will be introduced to Xello through their physical education classes. Students are free to complete the portfolio at any time on their own. Completion of this course will be determined

when all online modules are complete. Upon completion, students will receive a 0.5 credit. Course completion


does not factor into GPA or class work.



PROJECT VS. TEST



Teachers will have the option of assigning a project-based assessment instead of a traditional test. If a <u>project</u> is assigned, it will be completed by all students before the exam date. If a <u>traditional test</u> is assigned, it will be administered on the exam dates. Teachers will communicate the format of the final exams to their students.

EXEMPTIONS

In instances where a class is using a project for the final exam, exemptions will not apply as all will complete the project. Exemptions will only apply in instances where a traditional exam is administered.

EXEMPTION NOTIFICATION



Students will be notified of exemptions from traditional exams on or by Thursday, June 1st for all classes.



ADDITIONAL NOTES

- Students are only required to attend the class period(s) in which they have a traditional exam (if not exempt) provided they have their own transportation.
- If no transportation, students attend their classes following the daily schedule.
- Students who are exempt and/or have projects to complete instead of traditional exams do not need to report on final exam days.
- Friday, June 9th is a makeup day. Students will only report if they have makeup exams to complete.

Who Should Take the Summer Keystones

Summer Keystones are offered for any first time test takers from Spring 2023, re-testers or transfer students who have taken Algebra 1, Biology or 10th grade English. The Keystones are typically taken after you have completed these courses. If you have taken any of these courses in a school that does not do state testing (i.e. private, Catholic, etc), you are required to take each Keystone unless you are an incoming 12th grade student. Keystone testing is also offered during the school year in December/January and in May, however if you would like to get it out of the way over the summer, please sign up below.

Students Coming to Parkland from Out of State

If you have taken a state test equivalent to Algebra, Biology or Literature in another state and have reached proficiency, please check that the PHS Counseling Office has this paperwork. If we have the documentation, you will not have to take the Keystone.






Downtown Allentown City Center Welcomes PHS Graduates and Families


U.S. Physics Bowl

First day of practice for all other PIAA sports is August 14.


No student can participate or try out in a fall sport without a full PIAA Physical dated after May 31, 2023.


For the 2023-2024 School Year

Rising Juniors

All students who will be in grade 11 in the 2023-2024 school year will need a physical exam. This is a Pennsylvania State requirement. Forms were mailed home in February. Forms are also available on the PHS website. Please return these forms to the Health Room.

Rising Seniors

All students who will be in grade 12 in the 2023-2024 school year must have a SECOND DOSE of the meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV). This vaccine must be given at age 16 or older and prior to the first day of school on August 28.



Make Your Car a Classroom for Your New Driver This Summer

For many of us, summertime usually means vacations and summer road trips. When possible, make your car a classroom for your new driver. We all know practice and experience are the best ways to master a skill; sit in the passenger seat and create opportunities for supervised driving--even after your child receives their license. Quiz them on the meaning of road signs and pavement markings when at stop lights, ask questions like, "what did that driver do wrong?" and continue to give tips on defensive driving practices including safe following distances, scanning four seconds ahead, safe merging and exiting procedures. Now is also a good time to review these summer driving safety tips. A little planning and some safety checks might spare you from dealing with the consequences of a breakdown - or worse, a highway crash. Have your new driver perform the checks with you "Before You Go".

Stock Your Vehicle

Even a well-maintained vehicle can break down, so it is advisable to put together an emergency roadside kit to carry with you. Recommended emergency roadside kit contents include:

- cell phone/charger
- first aid kit
- flashlight
- flares and a white flag
- jumper cables
- tire pressure gauge
- jack and ground mat for changing a tire
- work gloves and a change of clothes
- emergency blankets, towels and coats
- maps

- basic repair tools and duct tape (for temporarily repairing a hose leak)
- water and paper towels for cleaning up
- nonperishable food, drinking water, and medicines
- extra windshield washer fluid

Plan Your Route

Before heading out, make sure to check the weather, road conditions, and traffic. Do not rush through your trip; allow plenty of time to get to your destination safely. Always familiarize yourself with directions and maps before you go, even if you use a GPS. It is also a good idea to let others know your route and anticipated arrival time.






2023 SPRING SUPPLEMENTS
