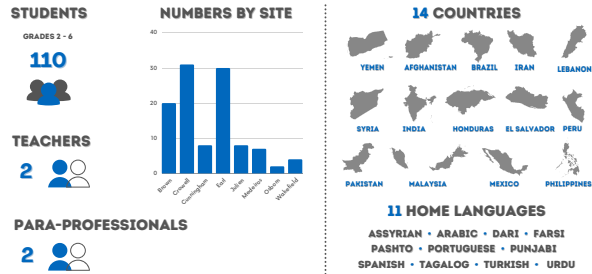


## About the Program

Two District Itinerant ELD Teachers and two District Itinerant English Language Development (ELD) Paraprofessionals provide supplemental ELD support to Newcomer students, grades 2-6.

Services are provided virtually and in-person. Groups are seen throughout the school day for 30 minute sessions.

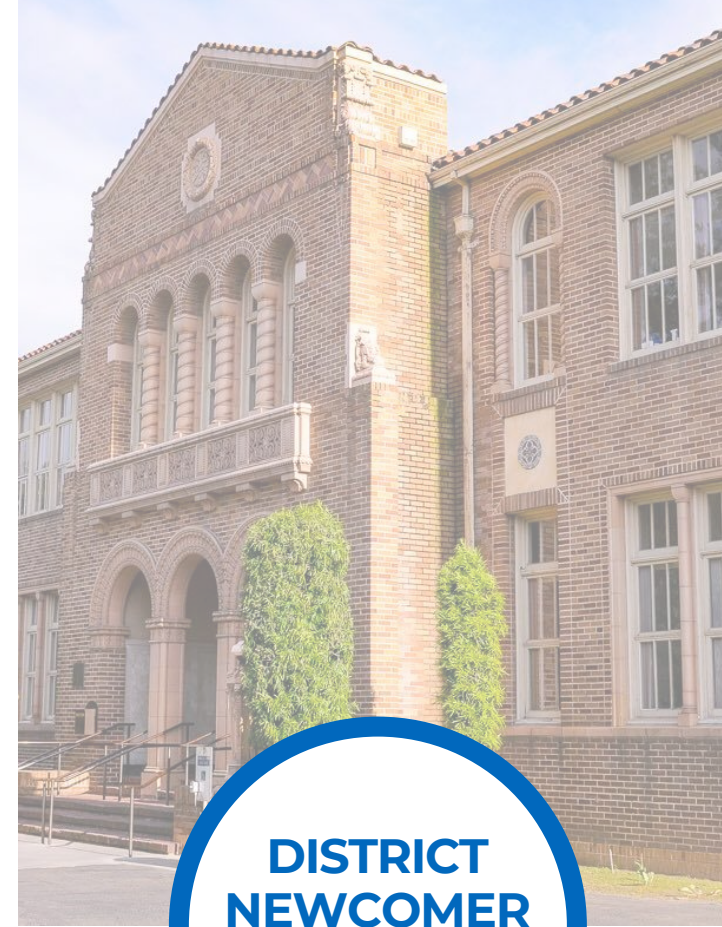
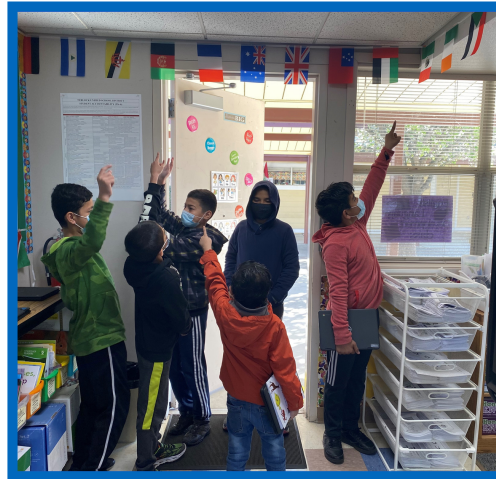

## Who are Newcomer Students?

Newcomer is an umbrella term for foreign-born students who have recently arrived in the United States. Newcomer students may include, but are not limited to, asylees, refugees, unaccompanied youth, undocumented youth, migratory students, and other immigrant children and youth identified by the local educational agencies (LEAs). Newcomer students come from many different countries and diverse cultural backgrounds. (California Department of Education)

### Focus

The District Newcomer Program focuses on supporting and providing supplemental ELD supports to students in grades 2-6.

### Referral Process

- Student enrolls in the district.
- The site Administrator submits a referral to the Office of English Learners, Assessment, and Special Programs.
- The District Itinerant ELD Teachers screen student to determine eligibility and placement.

## Supplemental ELD Groups

Supplemental ELD groups are serviced throughout the school day. In addition, students receive Designated ELD from their classroom teacher.

- Other Supplemental ELD Materials

### Assessment

Students are formally assessed three times a school year (pre, mid, and post)

- Oral language is assessed with the Individual Proficiency Test (IPT)/Ballard & Tighe
- Phonics and phonemic awareness are assessed with the Basic Phonic Skills Test (BPST)
- Writing is assessed via a writing sample aligned to the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC)
- Students can move fluidly from one group to the next based on their performance and language needs.

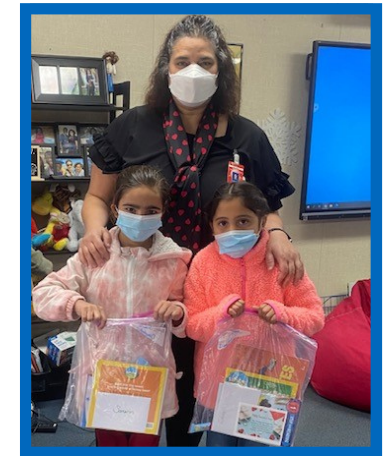
## Collaboration
