## The Cornerstone Project

Dear Parishioners:

I am most grateful to lead OLGC at a pivotal time of growth as we launch The Cornerstone Project, a \$12.5 million appeal for critical capital projects on our 23-acre campus. We have been blessed to receive significant support from parishioners which has allowed OLGC to kickstart this campaign and begin to address essential capital maintenance projects. We are grateful to announce we are  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the way to our goal. We now need your support to raise the remaining \$3.5 million to fully fund a new HVAC system in the school, new roof structures at the church, school, rectory, and administrative offices, and numerous campus-wide improvements to safety, security, lighting, and gathering spaces.

Since 1955, OLGC has grown exponentially to serve as the spiritual beacon for Catholic families in Vienna. We would not be the thriving community we are today without the foundation established by those that came before us. As OLGC has continued to expand and evolve, parishioners have responded with gratitude to meet our growing needs. And now, we must do our part to prepare our parish and school for the next generation of learners, leaders, and faithful servants.

It has been 23 years since the parish last undertook a major capital campaign. That initiative in 2000 gave OLGC its school gymnasium, school library, DeSales Hall, Chapel, Church narthex, preschool space, choir room, and additional meeting rooms. These spaces, alongside our main Church and school buildings, are vital to our mission and are constantly used by over 3,100 registered households and more than 600 school students and educators for worship, learning, and fellowship. In addition, OLGC offers faith formation for children and adults, daily and weekend Masses, sacramental rites, ministry outreach, extended care to school families, and community events to more than 9,000 parishioners. We must acknowledge the demands on the aging structures that enable our community to gather as a parish and advance as a school.

The Cornerstone Project will serve our community today, fortify our campus for tomorrow, and inspire a renewed confidence for our future together as a Salesian community.

# The Cornerstone Project

## Why Now at OLCG

The ability to provide the many services and ministries that make our community unique is increasingly hampered by failing, outdated systems and non-existent replacement parts for our aged buildings, particularly the HVAC systems and roof structures. Extraordinary pressure has been put on our infrastructure and the need for capital improvements is urgent and unavoidable.

Phase 1 of the HVAC project is complete, and the execution of the remaining HVAC phases, roof replacement, and other campus improvements will ensure that our church and school remain a beacon of prayer, sacraments, faith-enriched learning and service in our community.



## The Challenge We've Faced

The last capital campaign almost 23 years ago helped to finance the campus we know and love today, but the final project costs exceeded the original fundraising target due to unexpected expenses necessary to execute the work fully and properly. In addition, the economic downturn in 2001 negatively impacted some of our major donor pledges. Investments lost value overnight, and some donors had to step away from their prior pledge commitments. As a result, OLCG was forced to take a Diocesan loan to complete the project and was, in turn, saddled with debt service until the early months of Fr. Matt's tenure as pastor in 2016. OLCG has maintained and extended the life span of our existing systems; however those systems are now obsolete or without repair options, and we must replace them.

## Stewardship in Action

We have already made significant progress, thanks to recent generous pledges and one-time gifts. To manage costs, the HVAC and roof projects have been phased over four years. We have been able to complete the following capital projects:

- Phase 1 of the HVAC project was completed on time in August 2022. Phase 2 is due to begin in June 2023.
- The Diocese of Arlington Contracts Office is overseeing the HVAC and roof contracts.
- The Church sound system has been upgraded, allowing for live-streaming of Masses and community events, and an improved in-person experience.
- The Bell Tower and cracks in the church walls have been repaired.
- The campus-wide security system is being installed.

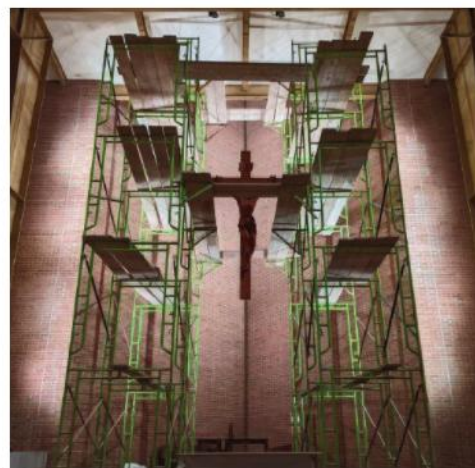


## The Current Perspective

## EXPLAINING PALLIATIVE AND HOSPICE CARE

Continuing from last week, here's the second and last part of a series attempting to shed some light on this important subject.

There are providers of this care, of course, but who are they? For palliative care, there are doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists, social workers, chaplains, occupational, speech and physical therapists, home health aides and services, psychologists and other providers as needed. Many experts distinguish between general and specialist palliative care. General palliative care is provided by the patient's primary care physician and includes managing symptoms, psychological and emotional support, discussing goals of care and advance directives, and other therapeutic services. Specialist palliative care manages more complex problems, such as complicated symptoms and coping difficulties. This is typically provided by various doctors who lead a team with palliative care specialists. Hospice care provides the same team with the addition of

bereavement counselors.

Another question often asked deals with where this care is provided. Many patients are referred to palliative care after they've been hospitalized, and others are referred after a life-changing diagnosis. Care can be provided, ideally, by your primary care physician. But you can also receive specialist palliative care in an outpatient center, a nursing home, an assisted living facility, or at home. Hospice care is usually provided at home or at a residential facility. There are also some residential hospices, as well as hospital beds designed for hospice patients, but these are often hard to come by.

Who pays for this care is a major concern for patients. Services for palliative care are covered by insurance in the same way as other care. Medicare, Medicaid, or private insurance may have a hospice benefit for Hospice care. Medicare and Medicaid have no limit on the number of days spent in hospice but those who have private insurance should check their plans carefully. Some insurers have a defined limit, with only a certain number of days available. Once patients have entered hospice, Medicare and many private insurance plans will no longer cover medication or other treatment related to the terminal disease for which the patient was admitted to hospice. Nor will hospice pay for care from any hospice provider that wasn't set up by the hospice medical team. Medicare also doesn't cover room and board at a nursing home or other residential facility, even though it does cover all other hospice services, such as medical care and treatment and therapies related to the hospice diagnosis while a person lives in such a facility. If the hospice decides that a patient needs short term inpatient or respite care, however, Medicare will cover it.

As for the duration of care, palliative care is provided if ongoing treatment is helping. Patients can continue with palliative care indefinitely. If ongoing treatment no longer helps and they are deemed terminally ill and likely to die within six months, they can transition to hospice care which will be provided for the patient until death.

For loved ones, bereavement care continues for a year or more after the patient has died. For patients who live longer than six months, Medicare and some private insurance providers will usually continue to pay for hospice if the patient's doctor certifies that the patient is still terminally ill.

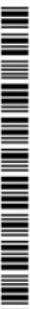

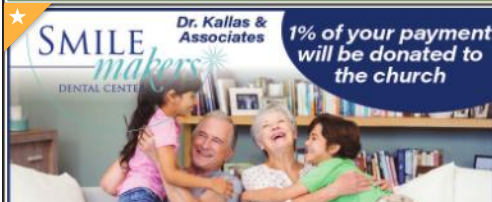
