Turn on closed captioning


Increasing print exposure through the use of captions can add many hours of reading

CHINESE

Students continued to learn Pinyin initials, Chinese words, and phrases. They were introduced to Qingming festival (Chinese Day of the Dead) and a famous Qingming poem. Most students also did Chinese activities. 5th graders read and talked about pandas. 4th graders learned about Chinese endangered animals. 3rd graders did a weather report with a Chinese weather word. 2nd graders learned about camouflage. 1st graders learned about Pandas' five senses and adaptations. Furthermore, students were introduced to some Chinese scenery and Chinese food. 5th grade Immersion

Chinese students practiced Chinese speaking, spelling, and Ping-Pong. Mrs. Lope's students are exposed to Chinese pinyin, Chinese numbers, and culture through songs and movement.

Our IB artists have been very busy wrapping up projects to finish out the year. First and second graders surprised their teachers with booklets of portraits from each student. Third graders experimented with "illusion" by creating OP art pieces. 4th graders created large murals that they then turned into animal face collages. 
Ms. Frazier's SIPPS students are wrapping up a semester of learning and applying phonics to improve reading. Students have made noticeable gains in their reading skills. Our SIPPS program includes plenty of vocabulary support for our ML students. We hope to start this successful program from the first days of school next year.

Ms. Danzell continues to provide push-in support and newcomer pullout for first through third grade students. Newcomer MLP students are showing growth by asking and answering questions in English as their vocabulary grows. Ms. Danzell looks forward to working with MLP students during Summer Reading Camp in June.

Ms. Krimm's 4th Grade MLP students worked on a 'Wacky Weather" flip book that coincided with their Science unit on Weather. Students learned about hurricanes, earthquakes, tornadoes, blizzards, tsunamis and the destruction they leave behind. learned about instruments used Thev bv meteorologists to measure wind speed, temperature, air pressure and more. Students from Grades 1-3 were supported in the classroom with their grade level units in CKLA, our new reading program.

Ms McIntyre's fourth quarter has been one of excitement and new learning for all the ML students in 1st and 2nd grade. Not only have they learned about American Independence in CKLA, but also learned important information about bees and their habitat on the field trip to the Savannah Bee Farm. Experiencing bees make honey was so amazing!! This was the highlight of this quarter and one that many students will remember for a lifetime.

Students worked hard on their IB PYP Exhibition Action Projects, wrapped up SC Ready, IReady, and MAP testing for the spring. Each student also completed their IB PYP Portfolios collected from all five years of their growth to share with their families. What a treasure to be able to see their growth over their five year journey with us at HHIES. Our 5th grade Multi Language Learners have grown so much over these five years. NURSE'S CORNER

It's been a great year as we have transitioned away from COVID protocols and back to a more "normal" way of doing things. As we close out this year and look toward next school year:

• If your student currently has medication at school, please pick it up before noon on June 6th or it will be discarded.



If your student will need medication at school next year, remember to have your provider complete a new order form dated after July 1st. Medication must be in the original container with a pharmacy label. Only adults can bring in medication. Students are not allowed to have medication.

- If your student will need additional Immunizations before school starts, don't wait, schedule an appointment now.
- When completing registration in Power School, be sure to include any medical conditions your child may have.
