

Downloading and Using E-books

Austin Seminary has access to e-books from multiple vendors, each with unique interfaces. These instructions describe how to download EBSCO e-books (our primary e-book provider), but a similar process will work for ProQuest e-books. E-books from other vendors, including JSTOR and ProjectMUSE are easy to access as PDFs at the chapter level and don't require additional software to download. Email library@austinseminary.edu with questions you have about accessing a particular e-book.

REMEMBER: You can also view, read, and print or email pages of an e-book from your computer or mobile device without downloading it. This is often the best choice. See instructions below.

Download an e-book to your computer

Before you begin (You only need to do this once!):

- Download Adobe Digital Editions (<https://www.adobe.com/solutions/ebook/digital-editions/download.html>)
- Open the software on your computer and go to Help | Authorize Computer
- Check the box for "I want to authorize my computer without an ID," or enter your Adobe ID and password. (If you choose to create an Adobe ID, [you can create one here](#)). Click Authorize.

Downloading your e-book:

- Use Sophi Search to find the e-book you'd like to download.
- Click Full Download. If you are off-campus you will need to log in with [your seminary credentials](#).
- Select the duration (up to 7 days) and format (PDF or EPUB) of your download, and indicate that you have Adobe Digital Editions installed, then tap the Full Download button.
- You can then OPEN the file in Adobe Digital Editions and read it off-line or SAVE it to read later. Depending on your browser, you may need to go to the file in your Downloads folder.

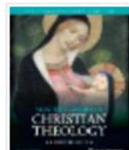

Read an e-book online without downloading

You can read any e-book on your computer without downloading it, as long as you have an active internet connection.

- Search in SophiSearch to find an e-book you'd like to read or follow a link from MyLearning.
- Click PDF Full Text or EPUB Full Text (when available) to access the online reader. If you are off-campus you will need to log in with [your seminary credentials](#).
- From there, you can page through the book, jump to a chapter, email a chapter to yourself as a PDF, and use the other e-book tools. See the [Reading EBSCO eBooks tutorial](#) for details.

Mobile device: Read online or Download

Before you begin (You only need to do this once!):

- Download and install the EBSCO Mobile app on your Apple or Android device. Use the Find my Library feature to locate Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary and then sign in using your Austin Seminary Credentials when prompted. See the [Installation and Authentication FAQs](#) for details.

Accessing your e-book:

- Use the app to search our collection of EBSCO eBooks by tapping the magnifying glass at the bottom of the screen. Tap a title to see details about the book. You can also tap the bookmark icon to add it to your saved items. Saved items will automatically sync to your folder when signed into SophiSearch on a desktop computer. Tap Access Now to see the access options for your title.
- Scroll down and tap Read Online to read the book in your mobile app. Tap Download Book (when available) to download the e-book to your device for off-line reading and select how long you want to check the book out for (up to 7 days). You can manage your downloaded e-books from the bookmark icon.

E-book tips!

- If you run into issues with the EBSCO Mobile App recognizing your account, just sign out and follow the prompts to find Austin Seminary and log back in.
- You can always re-download a book from your Checkouts folder while your loan is active. You can find this in the folder at the top of the SophiSearch page when you are logged in with your seminary credentials.
