What if I can't make a free clinic?

Here are five places you can visit if you can't make it to one of our free clinics:

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs):

FQHCs provide a variety of health care services, including vaccinations. You can go to a health center even if you don't have health insurance — and some may offer sliding fees based on your income. Call 1 (800) 722-4777 to make an appointment for all clinic services. Locations are available in San Bernardino, Hesperia, Adelanto, and Ontario.

Primary doctor:

If you have a doctor who you see regularly, you can schedule an appointment to talk about vaccines your child may need — and to get vaccinated.

Local pharmacy:

Many local pharmacies offer most recommended vaccines for children and adolescents. If you plan on getting vaccinated at a pharmacy, consider calling ahead to:

- Ask what you will need to pay . Many vaccines are covered by health insurance. If you do not have insurance, try to call a few pharmacies and ask what they charge for vaccines prices can vary.
- Find out if the pharmacy has the vaccine you need.

IEHP Members:

With IEHP, you can get vaccinated at no cost. You can also find schedules for your shots and checkups in your IEHP Member Handbook. Ask your Doctor for an Immunization Record Card or print one by logging into your IEHP Health Account and bring it with you to each checkup.
