# **Clinic News**

#### From School Health Services:

Hi Everyone, I hope the beginning of 2020 finds you well and healthyl Some days it feels like spring is just about the corner, but we still find ourselves in winter and with winter, comes sickness. If your child is ill in the morning (fever, vomiting, diarrhea, feeling too ill to participate) please let them rest at home. Our goal is to keep children in school, but we will notify you if they truly are not feeling well during the school day. If your child is diagnosed with an illness, please let the attendance clerk know what the diagnosis is when calling your child's absence in.

Here is a quick reminder of our guidelines for sending student's home from school:

- 1. Fever of 100 degrees or higher
- 2. 2. Vomiting
- 3. 3. Diarrhea

4. 4. Undiagnosed rash

Also: If your student has borrowed clothes from the clinic, please remember to wash them and have your student return the clothes as quickly as possible. The supply of clothes is quickly dwindling and the clinic needs all the clothes returned promptly.

Remember: If your child is sent home with a fever or wakes up with a fever, the student needs to stay home for 24 hours after they are fever free without the help of medication. Remind your child to wash, wash, and wash their hands with soap and water to help reduce the transmission of germs. Let's make 2020 the best! 5.

Dear friends, we would like to invite Mark Twain to once again participate in Hat/Hair Day on Friday, March 20th. We had fun with this event last spring and together we raised over \$2500! Some of you may recall that Faith Pruden was a first grade students who lost her battle with childhood cancer in 2010. She asked that we never let people forget her so a scholarship in her name was established. In 2013, the scholarship grew into the Friends of Faith Pruden Foundation, a 501(c)(3). This foundation now offers two college scholarships and support for Nationwide Children's Hospital "cancer kids" and their families. Our \$2000 Faith Pruden Memorial Scholarship is specifically for Westerville high school students while the second scholarship is for a Central Ohio "Cancer Warrior Kid." Each September, we proudly raise awareness of Childhood Cancer and the GOLD ribbon. We offer support to families on the oncology floor at Children's year round! This support often helps with utility bills, gas and grocery cards, rent, and anything else to help ease the family's burden.

### Intra-District Open Enrollment

Intra-District Open Enrollment applications are being accepted for the 2020-21 school year. The deadline for applications for middle and high schools is March 15, 2020. For elementary schools, the cut off date is May 1, 2020. The program is coordinated through the Deputy Superintendent's Office for families who are enrolled full time in the Westerville City School District. Parents or guardians wishing to have their children attend a different school from their home school of attendance must complete and submit an Intra-District open Enrollment application. With this program, transportation to and from school becomes the responsibility of the parent. Parents or guardians will be notified of the decision in writing. Application forms are available at each school building: at the Westerville City Schools Enrollment Center (300 Polaris Parkway, Suite 3200); at the Early Learning Center (936 Eastwind Drive); or at www.wcsoh.org, where general guidelines can also be found. 

# District announces 2020-21 Magnet Program application dates, open house details

The Westerville City School District (WCSD) Magnet Program offers students in grades 1-5 an alternative to the traditional delivery of content through the lenses of Math and Science, The Arts, and World Cultures.

Only students who are enrolled in WCSD by March 13, 2020, will be eligible for the lottery that determines Magnet Program admission for the 2020-21 academic year. Enrollment in Westerville City Schools is processed at the district's Enrollment Center, located in Suite 3200 of the OhioHealth Medical Building, 300 Polaris Parkway, Westerville. Details about the process to enroll in the district are available at www.wcsoh.org/enroll or by calling 614-797-7700.

Emerson Elementary hosts the World Cultures Program, while Hanby Elementary hosts the Arts Program and the Math/Science Program. - Friday, March 13, 2020: Application process closes at midnight;
- Friday, April 3, 2020: Invitation Letter mailed home;
