






The deadline for submission of entry forms and artwork is Tuesday, October 15th.

All students who submit entries into the Mark Twain Reflections Art program will receive recognition for their participation and are invited to attend the awards ceremony in their Honor! The top three winning entries for each category from each of the two divisions will advance to the Westerville City School District Reflection art contest with the opportunity to advance to the state or even national level!
