If your child is sent home with a fever, they must be free from medication and fever free for 24 hour before they return to school.

PRESCRIPTION MEDICINES

In order for a child to receive prescription medicines at school the office needs a medical release that has been completed by your physician and signed by the parent/guardian. The medication must be in a prescription labeled bottle. The medication and the label must match the medical authorization form filled out by your physician. If there is a change in the medication dosage, a new form must be sent to school and prescription label on the bottle must match. Over the counter medications can be given at school only if the above guidelines are followed. A form is published in the student handbook or available in the clinic. Please send only a one week's supply of medicine.

MARK TWAIN REMINDERS AND REALLY USEFUL INFORMATION

SCHOOL SAFETY

Parental cooperation in an emergency is essential to the safe and swift resolution of any incident. According to national school safety authorities, the most helpful parental response during any situation is to remain calm and wait for accurate information. We will share information as soon as possible, but please understand that this may take time as emergency responders and school officials obtain accurate details and determine how best to manage the situation.

Other important things to consider during an emergency situation include:

- Please do not call the school. It is essential to keep phone lines open so school officials can make outgoing emergency calls. If students are ill or injured, the parents of those students will be notified first
- Please do not go to the school. One of the greatest challenges during any school emergency is managing the people who may rush to the scene to "help." Not only may you inadvertently put yourself or others in harm's way, but by rushing to the scene, parents and others can actually create difficulties for first responders. Case studies have shown that people rushing to the scene of a school emergency can cause traffic jams that block emergency vehicles from getting to the scene and/or prevent the swift transport of the injured to emergency medical facilities. There may be a time, however, when parents are instructed to go to the school. If this occurs, remain calm, follow procedures, and cooperate with school and public

STUDENT EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION

This school year, all of your child's contact and emergency information and all parent permission forms are being maintained on line. NEWS FROM FOOD SERVICES

If your student receives free or reduced price breakfast and lunch and you have not submitted a new application for the 2018-2019 school year (July 1, 2018 thru current date) or you have not received a letter of direct certification, the child's status will expire on September 27, 2018. To ensure that you continue to receive the benefits for which your family qualifies, you need to submit a Free & Reduced Price Meal Application for the 2018-2019 school year. You may submit your application electronically by going to www.lunchapplication.com and follow the prompts.

Applications at the lunchapplication site can be processed in English and Spanish. Paper copy applications in English, Spanish, Nepali and Somali can be accessed at https://www.wcsoh.org and then by clicking on the food service link at the bottom of the page, If you do not have access to a com-

puter, you may pick up a paper application at your child's school or you may call Lonnie Robinson at 614-797-5993 and she will contact the school to send it home with your student. Lonnie can also assist you with the on-line application process.

If we do not receive an updated application by September 27, 2018, your child will revert to full pay lunch status. Meal prices at that time will be \$2.75 for elementary lunch, \$3.00 for middle and high school lunch; \$1.25 for elementary breakfast and \$1.50 for middle
