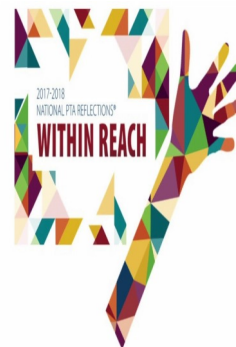

Seasonal Influenza Information

Influenza (flu) is a respiratory illness that can be serious, sometimes leading to hospitalization and even death.

Prevention:

1. Get a flu shot or the nasal mist
You cannot get the flu from the flu vaccine.
You need a flu shot every year. Wash your hands!
1. Cover your Cough! The flu is spread by respiratory secretions.
2. Stay Home when you are sick

Shorten the Duration with Medications such as Doctor Prescribed Tamiflu

Symptoms

Fever of 100 degrees or more or feeling feverish (not everyone with the flu has a fever)

A cough and/or sore throat.

A runny or stuffy nose.

Headaches and/or body aches.

Chills, fatigue and Nausea, vomiting, and/or diarrhea (most common in children)
