Device Return and fines

Families in grades K-1 whose students need a device for summer learning

Families of students currently in grades K and 1 who wish to check out an iPad for summer learning need to indicate so by completing the form at <http://go.nsd.org/techoptin>. Students and families are expected to care for the device and use it only for learning purposes. The device must be returned to school on or before the first day of the 2023-24 school year.



Students in 2-11 keeping devices over the summer

Students currently in grades 2-11 will be keeping their assigned computing devices over the summer months to allow for continuous learning. Students and families are expected to take care of their assigned device by keeping it charged and in its bag when not in use. Students who are enrolled in summer learning programs are expected to bring their device to summer programs each day. If families need support using their device or troubleshooting technical issues, they should create a help ticket at <http://go.nsd.org/studenttechhelp>.

Withdrawing or graduating students must turn in devices by 6/6

Families who are withdrawing from Northshore are expected to return any technology devices assigned to their student, including computers, tablets, hotspots and all accessories such as bags and chargers. Our school will be collecting devices on **6/5 or 6/6 outside Rm. 211 from 9a-12pm**. Withdrawing students who do not return their devices and accessories will be issued a fine for replacement.

Families who wish not to keep a device over the summer

Families may not need or want to take their student's device home over the summer. Families who wish to opt out of keeping their student's assigned device will need to indicate that they are "opting out" by completing the form at <https://go.nsd.org/optout>. This form will help our staff to plan efficiently for sending devices home for summer learning. When students return to school in the Fall, any student who does not have an assigned device will be assigned one for school year learning.

Mobile Hotspots

Northshore will be collecting mobile hotspots that are still in use by families during the spring of 2023, and **our records indicate that your family has a hotspot(s)**. Learn more about the ACP on Northshore's [Financial Assistance for Internet Access website](#).

We anticipate that many of our families currently using hotspots will qualify for the ACP. To qualify, families must meet one of the following options:

- Have a child who participates in the Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch or Breakfast program,
- The household's income is 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or less (currently \$60,000 for a family of four),
- A member of the household participates in certain other federal programs, like Medicaid, WIC, SNAP, or [Lifeline](#); OR



- The household meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income plan.

We appreciate families' understanding as we work to collect mobile hotspots and support families during this transition. **Please return your district-issued mobile hotspot on 6/5 or 6/6 from 9a-12p outside Rm. 211.** Please contact [Maren Johnson](#) if you have any questions about returning your hotspot or accessing the ACP.
