Ethos of the School

Carmel School is an independent Jewish Day School which follows Modern Orthodox principles and has a strong commitment to Zionism. Carmel places emphasis on adherence to traditional Judaism, as set out in the Shulchan Aruch (Code of Jewish Law). In Jewish Studies, Carmel teaches Judaism as a way of life, encourages each child to take pride in his or her Jewish identity and seeks to develop individuals who are knowledgeable and committed to the Jewish tradition.

As an academic institution, Carmel is an accredited International Baccalaureate (IB) School offering the IB Diploma, Middle Years and Primary Years Programmes. We are fully committed to achieving the highest international educational standards as measured against other leading international schools in Hong Kong and top private schools abroad. Students are taught by experienced, qualified teachers who empower each student to realise his or her own potential.

Carmel is an independent organization, unaffiliated with any synagogue. The School was established to encourage the participation of all Jewish families in the Hong Kong Jewish Community. Each student is respected for his or her individuality and Jewish affiliation and Carmel strives to cultivate an atmosphere of mutual respect and cooperation, embracing all students.

Carmel School prides itself on its highly qualified and high-calibre faculty, led by a visionary and inspirational Senior Leadership Team. Through a generous teacher/student ratio and curriculum delivery that caters for a range of learning styles, the School provides a supportive, caring environment that develops students' confidence, imagination and skills, across all academic and extracurricular areas.

The International Baccalaureate (IB)

The IB is a widely recognised school graduating programme. It is externally examined and assessed. It prioritizes personal research skills, philosophy and community service thereby ensuring depth as well as breadth of study. Math, language, humanities and science are compulsory components of the curriculum. We also promote the IB DP Bilingual Diploma, a unique qualification whereby students study two Language As.

The IB Diploma Programme (IB DP) Curriculum (Grades 11-12)

The *IB Diploma Programme (IB DP)* is made up of six subject groups and the *DP core*. IBDP students must choose one subject from Groups 1-5 and an elective from Groups 1-6. This ensures breadth and depth of knowledge and understanding in mathematics, their best language, additional language(s), social and experimental sciences.

The Core comprises of Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) and the Extended Essay, a 4,000 word research paper. Through the core, students reflect on the nature of knowledge, complete independent research and undertake a project that often involves community service.

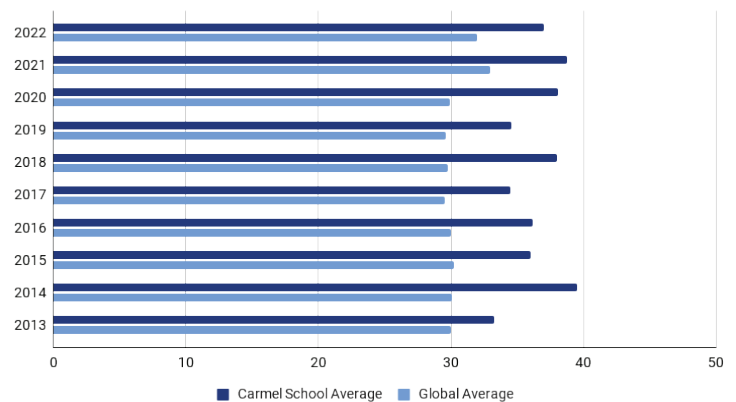

In the ten years of graduating classes from Elsa High School, four of our students have achieved perfect scores. Out of 150,000-160,000 candidates worldwide annually, only 150-180 achieve a perfect score.

Our graduating class of 2022 achieved an outstanding average score of 37, far exceeding the global average.
