NOTE: Students have many options to **ENTER** and **EXIT** from their academic studies into the workforce. When a student graduates from high school, they are eligible to choose one of many **ENTRANCE POINT** options: **1.** Enroll in either a 2 or 4 year post-secondary program; **2.** Enroll in an apprenticeship program or the military; or **3.** Enter the workforce using technical skills learned in high school. When a student finishes a 2- or 4-year degree program, they may choose to **EXIT** and **1.** Enroll in an apprenticeship program or the military; **2.** Enroll in a professional university degree program; or **3.** Enter the workforce using technical skills learned.

Financial Services Career Pathway Completers - Industry Credentialing for High School Students

Upon completion of sequenced courses in the Financial Services Pathway, students are eligible to complete the Industry-Recognized student credential for fulfillment of the End of Pathway Assessment. Secondary students completing the Financial Services pathway will be able to sit for the National Industry Credentialed assessment offered on-line from NOCTI and WISE. Once mastery is reached, students will receive recognition for completion and use this credential in conjunction with their job or continuing training. Financial Services Pathway Description

The Finance Career Cluster prepares students for careers in financial and investment planning, banking, insurance and business financial management. Finance career opportunities are available in every sector of the economy and require skill in organization, time management, customer service and communication.

Students in finance learn and practice skills that prepare them for diverse post-high school education and training opportunities, from apprenticeships and two-year college programs to Four-year College and graduate programs.

Workers in this pathway provide services to policyholders and insurance companies. Jobs in this pathway involve managing other people's money and helping other people reach their financial goals. This pathway is involved in directing companies' investment policies and preparing financial documents for regulatory authorities.

Occupations in this pathway include loan officer, teller, compliance officer, credit analyst, new accounts clerk, internal auditor, bill collector, mortgage underwriter, customer service representative, and commercial loan specialist.
