

JMS Community Values

The <u>Core Values & Non-Negotiables</u> <u>page</u> of the JMS website lists the values that guide our school community. This newsletter will occasionally feature one of these values/non-negotiables in more detail, to assist families in understanding and discussing them.

Jet Cards are used to call attention to both positive and negative student behavior and choices. JMS wants to highlight all the good things students are doing! Please check your student's agenda for more information.

Non-Negotiable: Back & Forth

What does it mean that students will accept the response of staff without negotiation? It means that there are limitations on the time and place for students to advocate for themselves and ask questions. Back-and-forth arguing and negotiation cannot interrupt classroom instruction.

Examples of positive student advocacy that align with JMS values:

- Raise hand and ask when to meet and discuss the situation
- Email teacher to set a meeting to discuss a question/concern
- Talk to a student council rep about the issue
- Discuss concerns with their advisory teacher, consider asking for group discussion of concerns during advisory period
