The School

College Park High School (CPHS), situated in suburban Pleasant Hill, is one of six high schools in the Mt. Diablo Unified School District. Pleasant Hill has a population of approximately 33,000 and is situated about thirty miles east of San Francisco.

Faculty

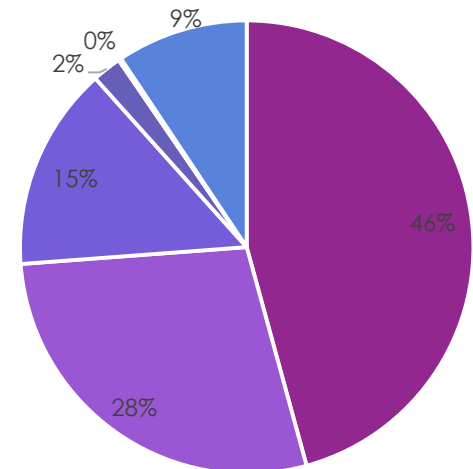
There are 89 teachers serving approximately 2,000 students in grades nine through twelve—a ratio of 1 teacher to 24 students. This academic year 5 school counselors and 1 college and career adviser (CCA) assist students.

Student Body

College Park students reflect their surrounding community: about 12.5% English Language learners, 24% economically disadvantaged, and 10.5% first-generation college students. Most families are middle income. Families are responsible for transporting their student to and from school, as there are no school buses.

Students participate in a wide range of clubs and activities at College Park. For three years, there's been a peer-tutoring program and over half the student body is involved in athletics. The school is impacted, so not all students are guaranteed enrollment in our school district. This academic year, the average class size was 31. This year the school district cut several sections of classes due to a constrained budget—this affected many of the elective choices for freshmen and sophomores.

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Graduation

Graduation requirements from College Park High School comply with those of Mt. Diablo Unified as noted below:

English	4 years
Mathematics	2 years
Social Science	3 years
Science	2 years
Fine Arts/Foreign Language/CTE	2 years
Physical Education	2 years
Minimum Credits	220 credits (160 required and 60 elective)

In 2018, 97.8% of students graduated College Park with 42% enrolling in a 4-year school and 44% enrolling in a 2-year school.

Academic Requirements and Grading

Our school offers a majority of college preparatory classes that are UC/CSU approved classes. The school year is divided into 2 semesters, each consisting of two quarters. Grades are issued at the end of each quarter and the end of each semester. In each class, a student receiving a passing grade for the semester is awarded 5 credits. All classes receiving credit are included in the computation of total GPA and class rank. A full course load would normally comprise 6 classes.

The grading system at CPHS is as follows with grade point values, where applicable, listed in parenthesis:
