2011 Legislative Session



FWCS Lobbying Results

- Firmed up relationships with legislators in leadership roles, setting foundation for future
- Charter Schools
 - Conversion charter vote not allowed for closed buildings
 - Students at charters shall be expelled not "separated"
 - Mayor of 2nd class city not allowed sponsor
 - Maintain current transportation dollars and service
- Vouchers kindergarten not counted as one year in public school
- Formula transition dollars received by some districts go away over 7 years instead of 9

Additional Funding for Full-Day Kindergarten

- Does not fully fund program
- Currently \$58.5 grant
 - FWCS share about \$2.5 million
- Additional funding of \$19 million provided
- Amount FWCS receives will depend on statewide participation

New Circuit Breaker Relief

- State Replacement Grant ended 2010
- Debt payments must be made, so circuit breaker loss transfers to other funds
- Referendums are outside of circuit breaker parameters
 - Consideration should be provided to old debt that also met taxpayer approval
- New option allows debt restructuring if non-debt loss > 30%
 - Allowed to levy original payment schedule, but reduce actual payments
- FWCS estimated 2011 loss
 - \$5.9 million, or 8% of levy
 - 11% of non-debt levy
 - FWCS not eligible for relief

Changes to Charter School Law

- Sponsorship
 - Current public university and Mayor of Indianapolis
 - New new charter school board, private universities
- Buildings Allows charters to use unused school buildings after 2 years for \$1/year
- Transportation proposal to shift district funding to charters not approved

New Vouchers

- Provides funding for private schools after one year in a public school (not counting kindergarten)
- Maximum 7,500 vouchers 2011-12 and 15,000 2012-13
- Income level for a family of 4
 - Less than \$41,000 90% of state tuition support
 - \$41,000 to \$61,000 50% of state tuition support
- Maximum voucher value
 - \$4,500 grades 2-8
 - Nearly \$5,000 for high school

School Funding Formula



General Fund State Revenue

- State increase
 - 2012 = .5%, foundation flat (after state \$300 million cut in 2011)
 - 2013 = 1.0%, foundation increased \$125/pupil
 - 2 year total = 1.5%
 - Special Ed & Voc Ed flat
- FWCS increase
 - 2012 = 1.6%, \$3.1 million
 - 2013 = .8%, \$1.5 million
 - 2 year total = 2.4%

- Assessed Value FWCS Boundaries
 - 2010 \$7.1 million
 - 2011 \$6.7 million, 5.2% decrease
- Levy
 - 2011 \$58.4 million
 - 2012 \$60.3 million, 3.2% increase
 - Reminder increase due to bus replacement plan reaching 12 year replacement plan (after 10 year plan)
- Tax Rate went up from .8271 to .9000, 8.8%
- District-wide tax rate for all units also up,
 results in higher circuit breaker

General Fund Budget Outlook

- Expected expenditure increases greater than new revenue
- Budget cuts likely
 - \$1 million in central office through BET
- o 2011-12
 - Teacher lay-off notice by July 1
 - Expect no district-wide teacher lay off, but waiting for final Title I allocation before decision.
 - Stimulus jobs continue with Federal Jobs money

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
