#### UC/CSU A-G Requirements:

- A: History- 2 years (World History & US History)
- **B: English-** 4 years
- C: Math- 3 years, 4 years recommended (Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II)
- D: Laboratory Science- 2 years
  - Life Science (Biology, Physiology)
  - Physical Science (Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics)
- E: LOTE- 2 years (Level 2), Level 3 recommended
- F: VAPA- 1 year

G: College Prep Elective- 1 year (Gov/Econ, Math, Science, or LOTE goes here)

#### WHAT IS A-G?

THE A-G/COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS ARE A SEQUENCE OF HIGH SCHOOL COURSES STUDENTS MUST COMPLETE WITH A C OR BETTER TO BE *MINIMALLY* ELIGIBLE FOR ADMISSION TO UC/CSU AND OTHER 4 YEAR UNIVERSITIES.

## Honors & Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- □ Honors and AP classes have accelerated/rigorous curriculum.
- □ Honors give a GPA bump, but no college credit.
- □ AP courses have an AP exam and students <u>may</u> receive college credits for the course as well as a GPA bump
- □ UC's & CSU's limit the gpa bump you can receive up to <u>4 classes</u>, with no more than <u>2 classes from 10<sup>th</sup> grade</u>. You may take additional AP & Honors classes but the Honors/GPA bump (for UC's and CSU's) will only be applied to 4 classes.





## WHAT HAPPENS IF A CLASS IS FAILED?

- To earn high school credits for a course you MUST receive a D or higher at the semester. (C's or better to be eligible for College)
- You MUST make up failed courses in order to graduate high school.

Quarter grades are NOT final, they are a progress report.

Options for Credit Recovery or Grade Improvement:

1. Summer School

- 2. Take a 0 Period Apex credit recovery course
- 3. Repeat the class the next year

# Scheduling

- Schedule changes only happen within the first 3 weeks of the Fall semester <u>AND</u> the first 2 weeks of the the Spring semester.
- Schedule changes are only permitted for
  - Missing a necessary class/credits for graduation
  - Enrolled in the wrong course
  - A class was repeated and needs to be adjusted so that credits are not missed
- Course requests cannot always be guaranteed
- One class change may adjust your entire schedule
- Students cannot request a schedule change for a different teacher

- Private/Out of State Colleges and Universities (examples: Saint Mary's College, University of San Francisco, Stanford)


What is the difference between a Community College (2+ year) and 4-year University/College?

#### **COMMUNITY COLLEGE**:

DEGREES TAKE ABOUT TWO TO THREE YEARS TO COMPLETE (ASSOCIATES DEGREE), OFFERS TRANSFER TO A 4-YEAR COLLEGE CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS.

#### **4 - YEAR UNIVERSITY:**

BACHELOR DEGREES TAKE 4 (OR MORE) YEARS TO COMPLETE MANY COLLEGES OFFER GRADUATE PROGRAMS (MASTERS, CREDENTIALS, PHD )



## **COLLEGE BOUND STUDENT ATHLETES**

Register for NCAA Eligibility Center no later than Junior Year
• Eligibilitycenter.org

Complete a total of 16 Core Courses in:

- O English, Math, Science, Social Science, Foreign Language
- ○10 of the 16 core must be completed <u>PRIOR</u> to Senior year
- Earn over a 2.3 GPA (in your 16 core)
- ○SAT/ACT Scores\*\*

Not all courses are approved for NCAA-work with your Academic Counselor (especially online courses or credit recovery courses!)

Need to repeat a class? - See your Counselor

## **COLLEGE & DISCIPLINE RECORD**

#### Counselor must answer....

"Has the applicant ever been found responsible for a disciplinary violation at your school, whether related to academics misconduct or behavioral misconduct, that resulted in the applicants probation suspension, removal, dismissal, or expulsion from your institution?"

#### Yes



Students must answer.....

"Have you ever been found responsible for a discipline violation...whether related to academic misconduct or behavioral misconduct that resulted in a disciplinary action? (Could include, but are not limited to: probation suspension, removal, dismissal, or expulsion from the institution.)"

SO REMEMBER: YOUR ACTIONS IN HIGH SCHOOL MATTER LATER IN LIFE. BE SMART, BE KIND, USE YOUR WORDS WISELY IN PERSON, ESPECIALLY IN WRITING AND ON SOCIAL MEDIA. DO YOUR BEST.


