Private/Out of State - Colleges and Universities

What is A-G?

The A-G/college entrance requirements are a sequence of high school courses students must complete with a C or better to be *minimally* eligible for admission to UC/CSU and other 4 year universities.

CPHS Graduation
Requirements:

English- 4 years 40 credits

Math- 3 years 30 credits

Must pass <u>Algebra 1</u>

Science- 2 years 20 credits

• 10 credits Life Science

• 10 credits Physical Science

Social Studies- 3 years 30 credits

VAPA, World Language, CTE 20 credits

Need two of three areas

Electives 60 credits

Physical Education - 2 years 20 credits

**D's = Passing Credits 220 Credits

UC/CSU A-G Requirements:

A: History- 2 years (World History & US History)

B: English- 4 years

C: Math- 3 years, 4 years recommended (Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II)

D: Laboratory Science- 2 years

- Life Science (Biology, Physiology)
- Physical Science (Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics)

E: LOTE- 2 years (Level 2), Level 3 recommended

F: VAPA- 1 year

G: College Prep Elective- 1 year

(Gov/Econ, Math, Science, or LOTE goes here)

xxC's or better

Honors & Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- ☐ Honors and AP classes are accelerated rigorous curriculum.
- ☐ Honors give a GPA bump but no College Credit.
- □ AP Courses have an AP exam and students can receive college credits for the course as well as a GPA bump.
- □ UC & CSU limit the number of weighted classes to 4, with no more than 2 classes from 10th grade.


Undergraduate & Graduate

4 YEAR UNIVERSITIES / COLLEGES



California Community College System

- ➤ 116 Community Colleges
- Earn a degree, transfer to a 4-year university, or earn a certificate
- ➤ No SAT or ACT is required for registration
- Students do not apply...students <u>register</u> for community colleges

Academic Topics to Keep in Mind

What is the difference between a Community College (2+years) and 4-year University/College?

 <u>Community College</u>: degrees take two to three years to complete (Associates Degree), offers transfer to a 4-year college, and certificate programs.

4 - year University: Degrees take 4 (or more) years to complete.
 Bachelor Degrees. Many colleges offer

graduate programs too.

Requirements:

- Minimum 2.5 gpa (10th-11th grade only)
- Application (same application for all campuses)
- \$70 fee per campus

NO letters of recommendation NO essay

Application filing period: October 1- November 30

*Currently under review by the CSU system

University of California


10 UC Campuses throughout California Only 9 Open to Undergraduates

Requirements:

- Minimum 3.0 gpa (10th & 11th grade only)
- UC application (same application for all campuses)
- 4 Personal Insight Questions (pick 4 out of 8)
- \$70 fee per campus

NO letters of recommendation

All schools require:

- Common application (apply to multiple schools at same time) or college specific application
- Send official test scores**
- Pay application fee
- Personal statement or essay
- Letters of recommendation (0-3 max)

Application filing periods vary

Historically Black colleges and universities are institutions of higher education founded to educate Black students. In the 19th century, when many colleges and universities refused to admit Black applicants, HBCU's offered those students a route to higher education.

There are 107 colleges in the United States that are identified by the US Department of Education as Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU's).


