

Distance Learning Schedule Overview



Download the bell schedule.

- Blocks on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday are 80 minutes long, which will include 40 minutes of live interaction. The live interaction can be continuous or split over the block.
- Wednesday Block is for 60 minutes of live interaction that will rotate through one period each week.
- Zero period will be for 40 minutes a day with 20 minutes of live interaction.
- All teachers will assign 40 minutes of independent work on Wednesday to reinforce student learning.
- Lunch is extended so that students have time to pick up lunches from MDUSD school sites.
- Teachers will be available to provide extra support during Virtual Office Hours on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.
- Students are expected to attend class and roll will be taken daily.
- Grades will appear on progress reports, report cards and on transcripts.
- Google Classroom will be the primary electronic platform for students.
