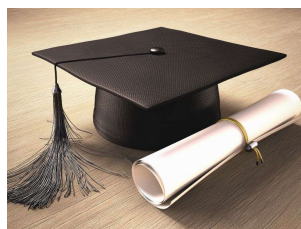

Student Accomplishment: Colin Kirby

Colin started racing Quarter Midgets (small blue cars) when he was 9 years old. He raced for 4 years winning multiple championships and 2 Sportsman of the Year awards.

In 2019 Colin decided he wanted to race Micro Sprint Race cars. The car we bought had the wrong engine for the class we were running so Colin spent most of his first season running mid pack.

For the 2020 season we bought a new motor and Colin finally had the chance to showcase his abilities behind the wheel! We attempted 30 races at 4 different tracks. Colin had 3 feature wins, 11 top 3, 20 top 5, and 26 top 10 finishes. Colin finished 3rd in Championship points at one of the most prestigious tracks on the west coast. After Colin's regular season success we decided to attend the Tulsa Shootout, the "Super Bowl " of Sprint Car racing. Colin understood his chances were not very good because of the caliber of the competition, and the amount of entries. The best drivers in the country with factory support and unlimited budgets.

In Tulsa, Colin raced his way straight into the top 16 in the first set of qualifiers. This gave him a 15th place starting position in the Saturday Night Feature event while the rest of

the 92 car field had to battle for the last 8 spots through lower mains and Last chance qualifiers. Colin started 15th and finished 7th among the best drivers in the country.

Colin showed that he can hang with the big teams using his skills and determination.

Colin works extremely hard every week so he can continue to race. He cleans and maintains the race car, he makes his own set up decisions on race day, he studies the tracks and other drivers to give himself an advantage.

Colin hopes to move into the Midget and Sprint car ranks in the next few years pending sponsorship.

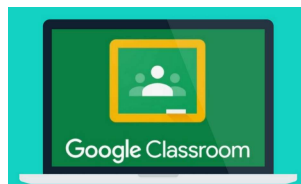

Recording of Classroom Lessons by Students, Parents or Teachers

There have been many questions regarding recordings of online sessions, so I want to share the guidelines we are following at College Park.



- Video recordings of classroom instruction qualify as "education records" under the Family Educational Rights Privacy Act, and as such are protected by state and Federal privacy laws. The following rules apply:
- Recordings by teachers of classroom instruction for distribution to students for educational purposes are permitted by FERPA. When used for an educational purpose, recordings of a classroom by a teacher are not considered an "educational record."
- Recordings by students of lessons for educational purposes are permitted but only if expressly authorized by the teacher. Under California Education Code Section 51512 it is illegal for any person - including the student - to record what is happening in the classroom without the consent of the teacher.
- Recordings by parents of lessons for widespread distribution, or for virtually any use, are not permitted by the California Education Code. Again, it is illegal for a parent to record classroom instruction without the expressed and written consent of the teacher, and such recording may not be distributed to third parties (such as in social media) under FERPA. See Ed. Code Section 51512.

Attendance Procedures in Distance Learning

Email attendance clearances, excuses, issues, concerns and updates to the [Attendance Secretary](#).

Teachers are recording each student's attendance through the codes provided by CA State to represent their highest level of participation for that day:

- P = Present: Online synchronous instruction, 1:1 office hours
- 4 = Online Activity: Completed a test, turning in assignments, etc.
- 3 = Communication w/ Certificated Staff: 2-way communication with student and/or parent online or by email
- A = Absent (none of the above engagement)

Support Staff Code:

- 6 = Support Service Access: Speech Therapy, OT, PT, Counseling

Distance Learning Student Expectations & Protocols for Online Meetings

- Students must login using their MUDSD.Net email account
- Log-on to Zoom/Google Meet five minutes prior to class starting
- Have First and Last name correctly spelled on your Zoom/Google Meet window
- Keep cameras on (if possible) and Microphones on Mute unless speaking to teacher or as directed by teacher.
- Students should be in appropriate school attire during online meetings
- Use the Chat appropriately (To ask questions, connect to teacher)
