WHY COLLEGE/CAREER READINESS IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

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Why CCRC in Middle School?

Our research shows that, under current conditions, the level of academic achievement that students attain by eighth grade has a larger impact on their college and career readiness by the time they graduate from high school than anything that happens academically in high school.

This report also reveals that students' academic readiness for college and career can be improved when students develop behaviors in the upper elementary grades and in middle school that are known to contribute to successful academic performance.

According to Harvard University, Center for Education Policy Research:

9th grade on-track status is highly predictive of future graduation and college enrollment outcomes.

■ Those who fall off track in their freshman year of High School tend to remain off-track in their 2nd year of high school.

Latest news: Research reveals importance of soft skills

Young job seekers should give applications a personality boost to increase their chances of success according to recent research.

Conducted by ICM Research the study interviewed over 4,000 adults, including 908 line managers.

- The results reveal that 38% of employers would like young people to give greater prominence to personal achievements and life experience in job applications.
- Managers feel that: young people are not aware of the importance placed on soft skills (37%)
- Soft skills should be listed ahead of qualifications (26%);
- Findings show that a strong work ethic, commitment, communication and team working ability are the personal qualities managers value the most in young applicants.
