HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS and parents/guardians of high school seniors, it is college application season! Navigating the college application process can be overwhelming if you do not have a plan and stay focused. Seniors must not only narrow down college options and write creative, well-written college essays but solicit letters of recommendation from counselors and teachers. We realize that focusing on your curricular and co-curricular assignments and activities, while simultaneously navigating the college search and college application process, can be both exciting and stressful. As you prepare for the college application process, please make sure you do the following:

- Speak with your guidance counselor regarding the college application process and request transcripts and letters of recommendation early.
- Make a list of your selected colleges' application deadlines.
- Utilize Naviance to apply for colleges via the Common Application at www.commonapp.org.
- Read the college application instructions thoroughly.
- Complete all sections of the college application.
- Make sure your college essay responds to the essay question.
- Check to see if the college requires an additional essay.
- Make sure you have at least two trusted adults proofread your college essay.
- Ask teachers, counselors, and others who know you well to write letters of recommendation.
- Print a copy of your completed application and other important documents.
- Confirm that the college has received your application materials.
- ALWAYS ask questions if you are confused during the application process.
- REMEMBER, we are here to support you!

Setting our Students up for Success!

21st Century Scholars Program

Indiana's 21st Century Scholars Program provides qualified students with up to four years of their undergraduate tuition at Indiana colleges and universities.

Middle School Students

In order to receive the 21st Century Scholarship, students **MUST** enroll no later than the end of their 8th grade year. We strongly encourage all 7th and 8th grade students to enroll. Students who meet the income eligibility requirements, will benefit from this scholarship.

High School Students

High school students must complete three Scholar Success Program activities each year, graduate from an Indiana high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma, earn at least a cumulative (overall) grade point average of 2.5, not use illegal drugs or alcohol or commit a crime or delinquent act, complete their FAFSA by April 15, and be accepted into an Indiana college or university.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVER	Strong focus on external evaluations such as grades Tends to view in extremes—"all or nothing"	Deemphasize grades and external evaluations Focus on growth, learning, and satisfaction first
AGGRAVATED ACCURACY ASSESSOR	Focuses on mistakes and spends extraordinary time creating "perfect" work Spends more time perfecting work to the detriment of socializing, extracurriculars, and even sleeping	Model mistakes Provide examples of imperfections in role models from books and movies Limit time spent on assignments
RISK EVADER	Disengages to avoid potential disappointment Avoids challenge, participating in class, completing homework	Provide safe environments for taking risks Praise efforts, not outcomes
CONTROLLING IMAGE MANAGER	Focuses on perceptions of others Tries to maintain image of perfection and high levels of success	Model good sportsmanship Praise process and effort vs. final product

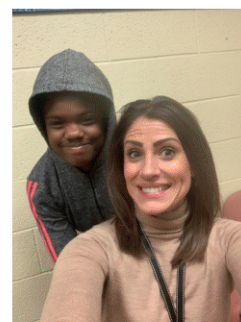
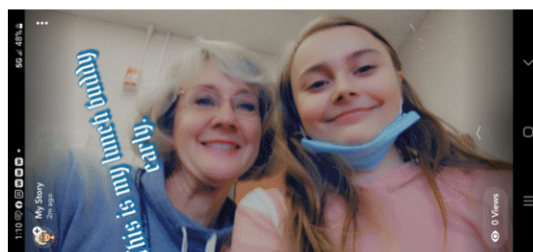

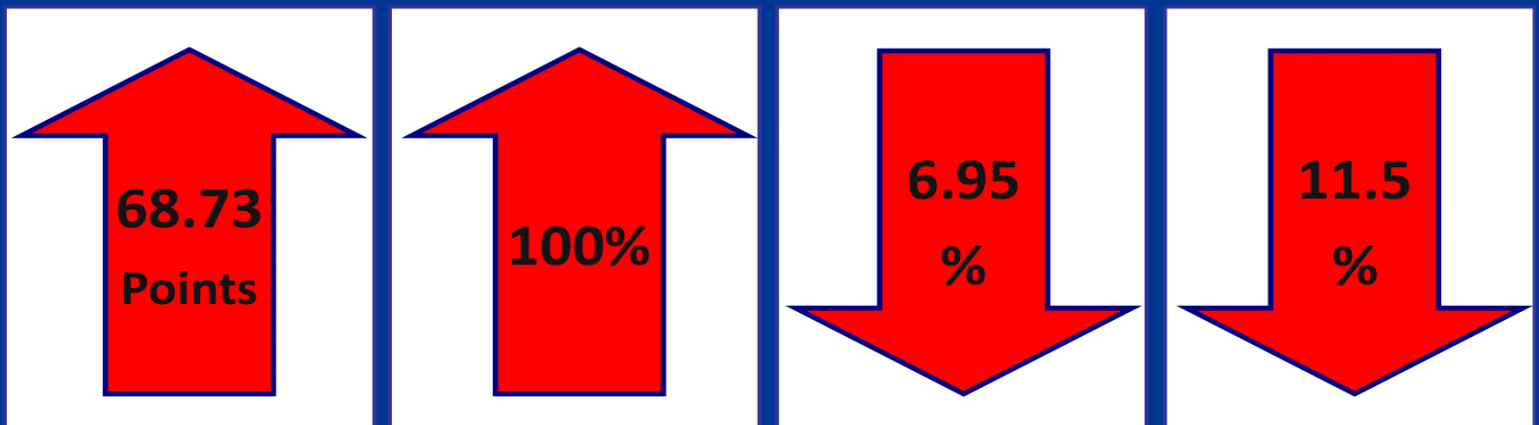
