Attention High School Seniors and Parents/Guardians of High School Seniors:

Financial aid makes education after high school more affordable, but first, students MUST apply by filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.studentaid.gov. The FAFSA filing season opened on October 1, 2022 for the 2023-2024 academic school year. This free government application uses financial information from you and your family to determine your financial aid award from the federal government to pay for college. Each year, millions of students who are eligible for aid dollars are unable to complete the FAFSA, leaving money on the table that could have helped them pursue postsecondary education. We do not want you to miss out on receiving these funds.

We realize that completing the FAFSA can be a daunting task for some individuals. Your Guidance Office and the K-12 College and Career Readiness Office will host various FREE events throughout the academic year to help you complete the FAFSA.

A great way for parents to get involved in their child's education is by volunteering with Fort Wayne Community Schools. By volunteering, parents and family members get to know their students' schools, teachers and staff. Anyone who would like to volunteer in a Fort Wayne Community School should talk with the school first to see what kind of volunteer opportunities are available.

Once a volunteer talks with the school, the volunteer should contact The Office of Community Programs. The Office of Community Programs supports Fort Wayne Community Schools by coordinating all background checks for volunteers in our schools.

In order to volunteer with Fort Wayne Community Schools, all volunteers must undergo a background check every three years. There are two types of background checks. A "limited" background check enables volunteers to work with students with immediate supervision from FWCS employees. A "comprehensive" background check enables a volunteer to be responsible for students without immediate supervision from an FWCS employee.

To obtain a new background check, or renew an expiring background check, volunteers should contact the Office of Community Programs at 260-467-8811 or email us at communityprograms.mailbox@fwcs.k12.in.us. The information that Community Programs collects from volunteers for a background check includes first and last name, email address, phone number, date of birth and the school they would like to volunteer at. After collecting this information, Community Programs will send the volunteer an email with a link to our background check vendor Safe Visitor Solutions, who will conduct the background check.

Once a volunteer submits their information to Safe Visitor Solutions, it takes 5-15 business days to complete the background check. When the background check is complete, Safe Visitor will email volunteers letting them know they are able to volunteer with FWCS.

Background Checks are good for three years in any school in the district.

21st Century Scholars Program

Indiana's 21st Century Scholars Program provides qualified students with up to four years of their undergraduate tuition at Indiana colleges and universities.

Middle School Students

In order to receive the 21st Century Scholarship, students MUST enroll no later than the end of their 8th grade year. We strongly encourage all 7th and 8th grade students to enroll. Students who meet the income eligibility requirements, will benefit from this scholarship.



High School Students

High school students must complete three Scholar Success Program activities each year, graduate from an Indiana high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma, earn at least a cumulative (overall) grade point average of 2.5, not use illegal drugs or alcohol or commit a crime or delinquent act, complete their FAFSA by April 15, and be accepted into an Indiana college or university.


