

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ENROLLING IN SCHOOL

ENROLLMENT AND RESIDENCY VERIFICATION

Online enrollment and residency verification is required for all students every school year.

Steps:

- 1. Verify you live within the district's boundaries. Find a map: <u>bit.ly/OPRFDistrictMap</u>.
- 2. Request a snapcode: <u>bit.ly/EnrollmentandResidencyOPRFHS</u>.
- 3. Complete enrollment and provide proof of residency online:

<u>bit.ly/EnrollmentandResidencyOPRFHS</u>. Please note: The district may require a home visit and/or additional documentation to verify residency. Without exception, the district runs a database check and conducts a home visit for every transfer student.

- 4. Submit health documents. See page 6.
- 5. Take required entrance examinations. See page 7.
- 6. Meet with a counselor to review course selections. (Scheduled once enrollment and testing are complete.)
- 7. Pay school fees.
- 8. Welcome to OPRFHS!

OBTAINING A STUDENT ID


Upon receiving a schedule complete with an ID number, counselor name, and Advisory assigned, transfer students may visit the Attendance Office (Room 1135) before school, after school, or during their lunch period to take a photo* and receive an ID.

IDs must be shown each morning upon entering the building and should be worn throughout the school day while on campus.

*ID headshots cannot be used as yearbook photos. Last-chance yearbook photo retakes typically take place in early October. Students who miss this deadline will unfortunately not appear in the yearbook. For more information about the yearbook, visit: <u>bit.ly/TabulaOPRFHS</u>.

LOCKER ASSIGNMENTS

To request the use of a locker, please visit the area of 2254 (*2nd floor main stairwell*) and see a Campus Safety staff member. Once a locker is issued, you will receive an automated email in your student email account containing your locker number, location, and combination.



REQUIRED HEALTH FORMS

The OPRFHS Health Services department believes that students are better able to reach their academic potential when they are at their best health.

The following required health forms must be submitted by October 13.

- <u>Medication Authorization form</u>
- <u>Proof of Dental Examination forms</u>


SPORTS PHYSICALS

Physical exams are current for 365 days, so the preferred time to get a physical exam is between May 1 and August 1, so it will not expire during the school year. Freshman athletes can use their school entry physical to serve as the athletic physical if it is dated after May 1 of the current calendar year.

COURSE PLACEMENT

PLACEMENT TEST

Transfer students who enroll at OPRFHS are no longer required to a placement test as long as academic achievement test data has been shared during enrollment.

During the enrollment process, grades, and assessment data can be uploaded online or emailed to Testing Specialist, Kim Asbury, at kasbury@oprfhs.org. If families can't provide grades and assessment data within a few days after enrollment, a placement test can be administered. If testing is required, Kim Asbury will arrange a time with the student to test during school hours, 8 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.

Academic data accepted:

- An unofficial transcript that identifies high school credits earned, or last report card for 8th or 9th graders if no high school credits have been obtained. Please note: An official transcript is still required as soon as possible in order to obtain proper credit.
- Recent standardized achievement tests in reading and math such as: MAP(NWEA), iReady, Renaissance STAR, TerraNova, Aspire, SAT, or PSAT.
- An IEP or 504 plan.

IF A PLACEMENT TEST IS NEEDED

Entrance

The student arrives at the OPRFHS Main Entrance on Scoville Ave. at their scheduled time. After checking in with Campus Safety staff, the student will be escorted to the Testing Center.

What to Bring on Test Day

Nothing is required. Paper and pencils will be provided.

STAR

The STAR Math and Reading Assessment is a computer-adaptive assessment that takes approximately one hour to complete.

- STAR Reading covers 46 reading skills over five domains including: analyzing literary text; word skills and knowledge; analyzing arguments and evaluating texts; comprehension strategies and constructing meaning; and understanding the author's craft.
- STAR Math is a computer-adaptive assessment that helps gauge mathematical knowledge in the areas of: numbers and operations, algebra, geometry and measurement, data analysis, statistics and probability.

English Screener

An English proficiency test will be administered to families who have identified through the Home Language Survey during the enrollment process that a language other than English is spoken at home or that the student speaks a language other than English.

The screener is an online test that covers four domains: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. This test can take up to three hours to complete.


After the Test

The student will be dismissed after completing all assessments. The student's counselor will gather recommendations from Division Heads and will have a meeting with the student to agree on a class schedule.

How to Prepare for Assessments

The STAR assessment requires no specific preparation because it assesses reading and math skills the student has already acquired. The English Screener also has no specific preparation.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT SERVICES

Teachers are always the first people to see when having difficulty in a class. In addition to teachers, OPRFHS also offers these resources:

• Tutoring Center

The Tutoring Center (Room 2315) is open to all students from 7 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and until 4:30 p.m. on Fridays. This walk-in resource does not require pre-registration, but a school ID, and in some cases, a school pass, is required.

Executive Functioning Tutoring is also available in the Tutoring Center (Room 2315) from 10:30 a.m. - 5 p.m.

• Library

The library (Room 3315) and is open from 7:30 a.m. - to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Students can visit during their study hall and lunch periods with a school pass.

OPRFHS supports trans, non-binary, and gender nonconforming students and strives to create a safe, affirming, and healthy school environment for all students.



SUMMER SCHOOL







OVERVIEW

OPRFHS offers a 24-day Summer School program during June and July for students that desire to gain academic credit through acceleration, remediation, and enrichment. A wide range of courses are offered in business, math, English, applied and fine arts, special education, and drivers education.

Incoming freshmen are welcome to pursue classes during Summer School to meet their educational needs and assist with their transition to OPRFHS.

REGISTRATION



CLASS SCHEDULE

- The daily class schedule will be as follows:
- Period 1: 8:00 a.m. 10:15 a.m., one semester credit
- Period 2: 10:25 a.m. 12:40 p.m., one semester credit
- Period 3: 12:50 p.m. 3:05 p.m., one semester credit

FEES

- Cost is \$250 per class, with some courses having additional lab fees.
- To help make our programs more accessible to all students, fees will be waived for students who qualify for free and reduced lunch. *See page 4*.
- All In-School Credit Recovery (ISCR) course fees are waived for Summer 2023.

TECHNOLOGY

CHROMEBOOK DISTRIBUTION

All OPRFHS students receive a Chromebook which they keep through the end of their senior year. To pick up a Chromebook and charger, please visit the Student Helpdesk, located in the Makerspace in the Student Resource Center. Student Helpdesk hours are: 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

Resetting your Chromebook password

All transfer students are assigned temporary passwords. Please reset the password as soon as possible. If you need assistance, a Technology Support Specialist at the Student Helpdesk can guide you through the password reset procedures, or you can view instructions at bit.ly/PasswordResetOPRFHS.

FAMILY ACCESS (SKYWARD)

Family Access (also known as Skyward) is our online parent/guardian portal for viewing contact information, checking student grades and attendance, paying school fees, adding money to a student lunch account, and communicating with teachers.

How do I log in to Family Access?

Desktop/laptop: Visit <u>bit.ly/FamilyAccessOPRFHS</u>.

Mobile: Download the *Skyward Mobile Access* app. Please note: You must choose a 4digit/character passcode for the app. OPRFHS has no way to reset it, so if you forget it, you must uninstall and reinstall the app to choose a new passcode.

If you do not have a computer at home, one is available for your use in the Welcome Center, immediately inside the Main Entrance. The Welcome Center is open Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. – 10 p.m. during the school year. Be sure to have your Family Access login information with you.

How do I get my Family Access login information?

Letters are sent to parents/guardians of all active students every year, usually during the month of July, with Family Access login information.

You may also use the email address you entered during online enrollment to retrieve your Family Access login ID and password. If you have forgotten your password, visit <u>bit.ly/FA_ForgotPassword</u> for password assistance. If you don't remember the email address you used during online enrollment, email familyaccess@oprfhs.org for assistance, and include the student's name, and student ID or date of birth, with the message.





REPLACING LOST/DAMAGED CHARGERS

Purchase a new charger in the Bookstore (Room 1337) for \$30. Charging stations are also available in the Tutoring Center (Room 2315), the Testing Center (Room 2336), and the Student Resource Center (Rooms 2315 and 3315).

BOOKSTORE

All textbooks are available in the Bookstore (Room 1337). Novels, workbooks, and initial art kits covered by the Instructional Materials Fee are distributed by classroom teachers. 

ATHLETICS



OVERVIEW

At OPRFHS, we have a rich tradition of athletic excellence and more than 1,900 OPRFHS students are involved in one or more of our programs. We currently rank third in the state with 50 Illinois High School Association State Championships.

We offer 30 sports programs, with more than 90 team levels and 120 coaches. There are both cut and non-cut offerings.

The OPRFHS Athletic Department embraces the teacher-coach model, where coaches strive to make the athletic field, court, or pool an extension of the classroom; teaching and development are priorities.

REGISTRATION

All registration for athletics is to be completed online. Visit <u>https://oprf.8to18.com</u> and complete your registration prior to arriving at tryouts.

Please note: Prior to being eligible to compete, all transfer students must meet with the athletic director or assistant athletic director to complete important IHSA transfer concurrence forms.

REQUIREMENTS

In order to try out for a sport you need to be a registered student, who resides with a parent or legal guardian within the boundaries of District 200 **AND** you need to have a current physical on file with the athletic office or bring a physical to the first day of tryouts. To check if you have a current physical on file please contact the athletic office (Room G-12) at 708-434-3600.
