Grading Periods

Brenkwitz High School operates under the district-wide calendar concerning holidays and breaks. The academic semester is divided into two quarters, allowing for **4 grading periods** a year. Each grading period is approximately 45 days; Students are expected to complete a minimum of **15 credits** per guarter, totaling **60 credits** for the year.

Credit/Attendance Policies

General Overview – this policy is intended to assist students, parents, and teachers in clearly defining what a student needs to do to earn credits in each class. In class credits are earned quarterly (every 9-10 weeks). This concept requires students to focus on their attendance, active participation & work completion. Due to the limited number of space available at Brenkwitz High School students upon enrolling must be committed to attending every day in order to earn credits. Students that do not maintain positive attendance (75% attendance rate) and/or not earning adequate credit per quarter (earning 7 or more credits) can be subject to be redirected back to their home schools.

How Does A Student Earn Credit?

Brenkwitz students are expected to complete all assignments and assessments given by the teacher. Students that earn a grade A-D can earn 3 credits per class. In order for students to receive the maximum amount of credits; students must have attended at least 65% of the class during that grading period. If a student does not meet the required attendance the most the student can earn is 1.5 credits. Opportunities to make-up missed class time will be facilitated by the individual teacher of that class.

Can I Make Up Assignments when I have been absent?

Yes, if your absence is excused. Students must present a legitimate reason to be excused from school. These reasons must be validated by a parent/guardian with a written note or telephone call. Please call (510) 723-3160 ext 60111 to speak to the attendance clerk or to leave a message. Please call in absences within 48 hours of absence. Illnesses lasting for more than 3 days will require a doctor's note. (If your absence is unexcused, you cannot make up the work).

Excused absences include: School-sponsored events, illness/medical/bereavement, prior approval from Principal/designee (court appearance, religious holiday, family emergency)

Unexcused absences include: vacation, car problems, visiting relatives, baby-sitting, oversleeping, suspension, and absences cleared after 72 hours,

Remember, students are responsible for the work they missed while absent. An **excused** absence does not excuse a student from doing the school work that was missed.

Parents cannot excuse a student who leaves campus without permission. Once the student leaves without a pass, it is a cut and unexcused.

Absences - Long Term

Students who will be absent 5 or more days, up to a maximum of 10 days, must contact the attendance office before the absence. Parents may request a Short Term Independent Study Contract. The Principal must approve this contract. This will allow the student to keep up with the assignments and give them credit for attendance. It is best to give the office at least a two-week notice of the situation. The assignments are due upon the student's return to school. Students may not get credit if the assignments are not completed satisfactorily and returned on time.

Graduation Ceremony Participation

Student who will be participating in June 9th graduation ceremony will be notified no later than May 31, 2022. By this date the student will have completed all requirements for graduation as determined by the principal. Students who have not completed aforementioned will still be able to graduate but will not participate in the ceremony

Closed Campus

All Hayward Unified School District high schools are closed campuses. Students are required to remain on the school grounds at all times during the school day except when special permission to leave campus is granted.

At Brenkwitz, that means students are not allowed to go onto the Adult School Campus to enter the Mocha Café or student lounge, or leave the gates to go out into the parking lot. If they do so, the consequence is suspension.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Anyone who refuses to show respect to our staff or fellow students will suffer the appropriate consequences according to District Policy. Our staff believes in helping each student develop a positive self-image by offering new opportunities for success in learning. We accept each student as a significant person who has a right to an education in a safe and positive learning environment. We believe in encouraging each student to think and act in a positive manner and to:

Adopt goals based upon his/her interests and abilities.

Master needed skills and knowledge for successful living.

Develop attitudes that aid them in becoming a productive and contributing member of society.

Through concerned and constructive guidance, we are dedicated to helping each student accept discipline and to develop self-discipline. The same rules of student conduct applicable to all students in the Hayward Unified School District are also in effect here. All students are expected to respect the rights and property of others and to conform to the rules.

Students involved in prohibited activities are subject to disciplinary action that may include any one or any combination of the following actions:

- Parent conferences
- Loss of privileges
- School Cleanup
- Reduced Schedule
- Suspension
- Site Administrative Contract

- Referral to police or probation agencies
- Referral to community counseling programs
- Referral to temporary alternative placement programs
- Referral to other educational programs (adult school, community day school, city as school, etc.)
- Referral to round table meetings
- Peer Counseling
- Expulsion
- Dropped from our program

High on our priority list at Brenkwitz H.S. is the desire to treat all students in a fair and equitable manner. Thus, it is our intent to establish clear rules and consequences that regulate student behavior. We ask that all students and parents read the rules and guidelines very carefully. You will be **expected to know and understand all of the rules** and guidelines that follow.

THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED AT OUR SCHOOL

These 13 violations are **CRIMES AS WELL AS EDUCATIONAL CODE VIOLATIONS**. If you choose to do any of the following acts; your choice will result in **one** of the following consequences <u>automatically</u>: **Expulsion**, **3 to 5 day Suspension and Site Contract**, and/or Ticket/Arrest by Hayward PD.

- 1. Possession/Brandishing of any **firearm**, **knife**, **explosive** or other **dangerous objects**.
- 2. Possession/Brandishing of an **imitation firearm**. Imitation firearm is defined as a replica of a firearm that is as substantially similar in physical properties to an existing firearm as to lead a reasonable person to conclude that the replica is a firearm.
- 3. Causing, attempting, or **threatening to cause physical injury** to any person (**Hitting**, Throwing an object at someone with intent to injure).
- 4. Willful use of **force or violence (fighting/Mutual Combat)** upon the person of another, except in clearly proven self-defense.

- 5. Committing **robbery** or **extortion** and/or being in possession of **stolen property**.
- 6. Possession, use, sale, or otherwise furnish, or be under the influence of, any **controlled substance**. (Alcoholic beverage or an intoxicant of any kind)
- 7. Unlawfully possess, offer, arrange, or negotiate to sell any **drug paraphernalia** on or about school grounds.
- 8. Commit an obscene act.
- 9. Commit any form of **Sexual Harassment** toward another person.
- 10. Commit or attempt to commit a sexual assault, or sexual act.
- 11. Harass, threaten, or intimidate a pupil who is a complaining witness in a school disciplinary proceeding for the purpose of either preventing that pupil from being a witness or retaliating against that pupil for being a witness or both.
- 12. Arson.

ADDITIONALLY. THE FOLLOWING CHOICES WILL NOT BE TOLERATED

The following acts are violations of the **Ed Code**, **District Policy as well as School Policy. These** violations will result in a **referral** to the office and/or a minimum **one day suspension**.

- 1. **Defiance** of authority. (Refusing to go to the office or do what your asked to do.)
- 2. Engage in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- 3. **Disrupt school activities** or otherwise willfully defy the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties
- 3. Possession of any **Listening Device/Radio/Phones** and/or Earphones in the classroom.
- 4. Riding skateboard, motorcycle or bicycle on school campus.
- 5. Driving in an **unsafe manner** while on or leaving school grounds.
- 6. Truancy and/or cutting classes
- 7. Students who leave campus without permission cannot be excused. All students are expected to check out through the main office before leaving.
- 8. Habitual Tardiness
- 9. **Leaving the campus** during the school day without a pass. Brenkwitz is a **closed campus** during school hours.
- 10. Loitering in hallways, bathrooms, off limit areas of campus.

- 11. Wearing **head apparel inside** the classroom or office areas.
- 12. Wearing gang related apparel.
- 13. Gambling anywhere on school grounds
- 14. **Walking away from any school official** when they are attempting to talk with you. Showing **disrespect** to persons in authority.
- 15. **Spitting** in doorways, hallways, classrooms, and bathrooms or inside of any structure on school grounds.
- 16. Throwing or leaving **food or trash** in any place other than a trash can.

Any student who violates any aspect of the code of conduct will meet with the Principal, Student's

Advisor and parent/guardian. The purpose of the meeting will be to:

- Determine if the student understands why we are having the meeting, and what he/she plans to do to correct the behavior problems.
- Gather pertinent information from all staff about student's behavior and progress in the classroom.
- Gather pertinent information from parents or guardians as to how they plan to assist their child in modifying the undesirable behavior.
- To decide what disciplinary action needs to be taken.

Support meetings are crucial and vital to maintaining a safe and orderly school environment for all. Therefore, it should be clearly understood that failure to show up for a scheduled meeting would not prevent the staff from moving ahead and making the necessary decisions that affect this case.
