Job Corps is the nation's largest free residential career training and education program for low-income young people ages 16–24.

To enroll in the program, students must meet eligibility requirements.

- Are low-income ✓
- Are committed to improving their education and future ✓
- Are in need of job skills training, education, counseling or related assistance to help get started on a career pathway ✓
- Are between the ages of 16 and 24 ✓
- Are a U.S. citizen, a legal U.S. resident, or are a resident of a U.S. territory and/or are authorized to work in the United States ✓
- Do not use drugs illegally under federal law ✓
- Do not exhibit behavioral problems that could prevent themselves or others from success in Job Corps ✓
- Do not have certain criminal convictions or require court supervision ✓

With 120-plus centers nationwide, a fresh start is waiting at Job Corps.
