640 KINDERGARTEN EARLY ENTRANCE POLICY AND GUIDELINES

I. PURPOSE

A student must be five years of age on or before September 1 of any year to be eligible to enroll In kindergarten classes. The Little Falls Community School District #482 views this age requirement as developmentally appropriate for a child to function successfully in the kindergarten program.

JI. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Little Falls Community School District is in compliance with the Minnesota Statutes 2002, 120A.20 subdivision I, which states that no person shall be admitted to any public school as a kindergarten pupil unless the pupil is at least five years of age on or before September I of the calendar year In which the school year for which the pupil seeks admission commences or as a 1st-grade student unless the pupil is at least six years of age on or before September 1 of the calendar year in which the school year for which the pupil seeks admission commences or has completed kindergarten; except that any school board may establish a process for admission of selected students at an earlier age. The early entrance process and criteria have been established for students who request admission at an earlier age.

EARLY ENTRANCE

The Little Falls Community School District #482 recognizes that early entrance to school is an important decision and should be limited to and reflective of the following process:

A. Selection Criteria for Early Entrance into Elementary School

To be eligible for early entrance to school the student must meet the criteria in the prioritized order listed below.

- 1. Birthday is prior to October 1 of the year student seeks early entrance.
- 2. Mental age is in the superior range (2 standard deviations) as demonstrated by ability assessments conducted by the school psychologist.
- 3. Competency in academic skills is demonstrated by the student on the school readiness assessments, which are conducted by school personnel (usually a kindergarten teacher).
- 4A. Demonstrated success in a preschool program validated by a letter of recommendation from preschool teacher/director

OR

4B. Social maturity is demonstrated by social maturity assessments conducted by school personnel (usually a kindergarten teacher),

B. Application Procedure

- 1. Secure application form at the elementary school of attendance. Complete and return by May 15.
- 2, Interview of parents and child by principal.
- 3, Assessments and Observations
 - a. Psychological
 - b. Social maturity
 - c. School readiness

Cos! incurred for assessment to be borne by parents. Costs include assessment materials; professional time for assessing, scoring, and reporth1g; substitute for teacher (if necessary). The cost of the assessment will be refunded if the child is admitted and successfully completes the probationary period.

- 4. Complete medical check-up at parent's expense. Immunizations must meet State of Minnesota requirements.
- 5. Post-assessment interview with parents and school personnel.
 - a. The decision for allowing early entrance will be made at a team staffing of school personnel (usually the principal and the kindergarten teacher) and the school psychologist.
 - b. If entered early, the child will be placed on a trial basis. The probationary period will consist of the first trimester. An evaluation using the "Early Entrance Probationary Checklist" will be made by the teacher at the end of the first reporting period with the option to withdraw the student from early entrance by the admittance committee.
