Persuasive Paragraph or Essay

Persuasion means getting other people to see things your way. When you write a persuasive essay, your topic is something you want to persuade people to do or believe. A persuasive essay expresses an opinion and tries to convince the reader that this opinion is correct. Persuading someone to agree with your requires careful thinking and planning. As a writer, you must make the issue clear and present facts and reasons that give strong support to your opinion. You are encouraging your audience to take a certain action or to feel the same way as you do.

Difference between persuasive and expository

- The topic sentence is an opinion statement.
- All of the sentences in the paragraph or essay will be opinion statements that support and try to convince the reader to think like you.
- Expository writing just gives explanations or information.
- Think of all the times you have tried to persuade your parents to buy you something that you wanted and all of the reasons you have given them to convince them to think like you! :)
