Founded in 1892, Hayward High School is one of the oldest high schools in the Bay Area. Hayward's official mascot the "Farmer" dates back to the community's agricultural roots. Nestled in the foothills of Hayward, the campus is more than 64 acres, with a modern, well-stocked library, several state-of-the art computer labs, a full gymnasium, a high quality weight training room, and several vocational shops.

Our 80 teachers average 14 years of experience and in 2007-08, 99 percent held a full credential. We have a diverse student body of just over 1,700 students. In 2006, 78 % of our students attended college after graduation, with 30 % attending a UC or CSU. Our academic performance continues to rise and our students earned a 52 point API gain last year.



The mission of Hayward High School is to provide an educational program founded upon the worth and integrity of each individual in our diverse population. We recognize that everyone has different needs, interests and abilities; we are committed to a comprehensive curriculum enabling each student to

> become a caring, thinking, p r o d u c t i v e , c o n t r i b u t i n g and responsible participant in our changing world. Our teachers work to provide a rigorous curriculum designed to challenge students and meet their learning needs.

Incoming 9th graders can participate in the AVID or Puente programs which work with students to provide a smaller learning community and achieve the goal of attending a college of their choice. We have accelerated English, math, and history classes for students who want to challenge themselves and also provide intervention classes for students who need more support.

In addition, we offer 9 AP classes, which are the most rigorous classes students can take at the high school level. Students can earn college credit if they perform at a high enough level on the May AP exams. Currently



we offer Advanced Placement courses in English Language, Literature, Calculus, Statistics, US History, Government, Biology and Spanish. The UC and CSU system grant students an extra grade point on their GPA for AP grades of C or higher.

Hayward High is one of the Bay Area's top schools for sports with a number of athletes that have succeeded professionally in their respective sports. Hayward High is currently a member of the Hayward Area Athletic League (HAAL), the North Coast Section (NCS), and the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF); offeing a full interscholastic athletic program with a total of 15 sports during the school year, including football, basketball, soccer, tennis, cross country, track, wrestling, badminton, baseball, softball, volleyball, swimming, and more. Over 700 students participate during the fall, winter and spring seasons. Within the past decade, our school has sent over 100 students to Division 1 schools to compete in sports.

The following further demonstrates HHS's outstanding reputation in the area of athletics. Our football team has won more games than any other team in the H.A.A.L, having held more than 23 titles, including 15 in the past 20 years. The HHS basketball program maintains a reputation of bringing collegic excitement to a high school gym. The Farmers dominated East

Bay Basketball rankings in the 80s & 90's and has helped develop talented players such as Nate Perkins (Eastern Washington University), Gerald Walker (University) of San Francisco), Eddie House (Arizona State, Boston Celtics), Marion Thurmond (San Jose State University) and Iman Mattox (Fairleigh Dickinson University) who is now our Head Coach. Hayward High offers over 30 clubs for students to explore our world beyond the walls of the classroom. Students interested in Biology, Art, Anime, Math, Business or any of our other club focus's can find a home. If they don't find a club to suit their interests, students are encouraged to start their own and broaden campus diversity.

As one drives to our football games, even if the driver cannot see the field, they can hear it! The bleachers are packed with not only screaming fans, but with the source of the tumultuous noise, The Pride

of Hayward High Marching Band. Students who find music as one of their forms of expression can cultivate their talents through lessons and performance in our choir, orchestra, symphonic band, jazz band or various other classes within the program.

Student Leadership is the center of nearly all student activity on campus. Recent accomplishments include partnering with local low income housing organizations

local low income housing organizations to bring holiday gifts to children without, a blood drive that donated enough to save over 300 lives and making sure the student morale on campus is kept high through lunch time activities. The enthusiastic students in this class also continue age old traditions like our Downtown Rally parade through downtown Hayward which kicks off our day's homecoming events.
