What is AVID?

- ✎ AVID is a support system designed to prepare students to succeed in a rigorous college preparatory path for admission to a four-year university.
- ✎ AVID serves over 50,000 middle and high schools in the United States and Internationally
- ✎ AVID students succeed in rigorous high school curriculum.
- ✎ 95% of AVID students enroll in a university or college after high school graduation (compared to 40% of non-AVID students).
- ✎ 84% of AVID students are accepted to four-year colleges right after high school (compared to 34% of non-AVID students)
- ✎ 89% of AVID students are still in college for their junior year.

What are AVID's Objectives?

- ✎ To provide academic instruction and support to students and to prepare them for four-year colleges and universities.
- ✎ To give students college level skills in writing, inquiry, collaboration, and reading.
- ✎ To prepare students to succeed in AP level classes.
- ✎ To prepare students to succeed in college.
- ✎ To increase students' levels of college choices and careers through completion of the A-G requirements and volunteer/community service activities.

What do students DO in AVID class?

- ✎ Learn with tutors and other AVID students.
- ✎ Write for all of their academic classes.
- ✎ Learn reading strategies and build vocabulary.
- ✎ Develop success strategies.
- ✎ Apply for college.
- ✎ Prepare for a professional career.
- ✎ Visit college campuses.
- ✎ Participate in extracurricular and community activities.

Who may participate in AVID?

- ✎ Students who have the potential and the DESIRE to go to college.
- ✎ Students who have a 2.0+ GPA and CST test scores of Basic and above in English and Math.
- ✎ Students who are willing to commit themselves to their homework and education.
- ✎ Students who are willing to commit to enrollment in a college preparatory sequence of courses.
- ✎ Students who are willing to develop good work habits.
- ✎ Students who have a good attendance record.
- ✎ Students who have appropriate classroom behavior.
