### Open House & Math Night

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### **DLI** and State Testing

One of the questions families might have about having their kids in a dual language immersion program is whether their test performance will be affected. The short answer is No. Studies show that <u>learning new languages actually improves test scores</u>. In particular, students in California who are taught in Mandarin for much of the school day generally achieve as high as, or sometimes higher than, their non-immersion peers who attend the same school.

### **Expert Testimonies**



Experts in the field speak highly of our Mandarin programs at HUSD. Jiaxin Xie, emeritus staff and former director of the Confucius Institute at SFSU, comments, "Stonebrae is one of the first schools in the Bay Area to have a Mandarin DLI program. **Their instruction and management are both first-rate**, with a supportive district and community."

Elizabeth Weise, author of *A Parent's Guide to Mandarin Immersion*, pointed out that "California has a

remarkable 100 Mandarin immersion schools in 41 different school districts, but of all those districts, only seven offer a fully built-out K-12 Mandarin Immersion program. Hayward Unified is one of those rare districts. ... It's a fantastic program that gives students something few other districts in the state, or the country, can boast of."






### Mandarin After School Program

### Stonebrae TV Appearance




### Visitors from SLUSD
