- If your student will not be attending YEP, please call or text prior to program at <u>510-935-1088</u>




What should students bring to YEP?

Staff will notify parents/guardians if additional supplies are needed








Recess Procedures

Late Pick-Up Policy

• The program closes at 6:00 PM daily



- Late fee is \$1.00 per minute, per child.
- On the 3rd late pick-up, student(s) will be dropped from the program.
- If your child has not been picked up within 30 minutes and emergency contacts cannot be reached, The Hayward Police Department will be contacted.

Masks

Masks are one of the most effective safety strategies to prevent the transmission of COVID-19



- Masks are required for everyone, regardless of vaccination status
 - Masks are mandated at all HUSD sites
- Persons exempted from wearing a face covering due to a medical condition, must wear a non-restrictive alternative
- Students who are not exempt from wearing a face covering under CDPH guidelines and refuse to wear one cannot attend in-person programs





Ventilation

HUSD implemented multiple ventilation strategies recommended by the CDC

Spaces with HVAC (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) systems

- Extensive review of existing HVAC systems was done.
- Upgraded to MERV-13 filters (or highest compatible filter). These filters will remove 90-95% of particles.
- Performing regular preventative maintenance and filter changes.
- Medify Air M-112 and MA-15 air purifiers have been provided. They remove 99.9% of particles.
- Maximizing outside fresh air by propping open windows and doors.

Spaces without HVAC systems

- Maximizing outside fresh air by propping open windows and doors and utilizing air purifiers.
- Providing air purifiers, which remove 99.9% of particles.





Classroom Ventilation

- Windows and doors open at all times
- Masks worn by all
- Air purifiers running during school/program hours







HUSD monitors the following sources regularly when local agencies are predicting unhealthy air quality:

- The Bay Area Air Quality Management District
- <u>Airnow.gov</u>
- Weather Underground

HUSD follows the <u>School Air Quality Activity Recommendations</u>. As air quality levels shift, we adjust our ventilation strategies to based on air quality due to wildfires.



Cleaning & Disinfecting

HUSD following guidelines developed by the CA Department of Public Health

- Frequently touched surfaces (bathrooms, door knobs, desks, etc.) will be cleaned daily.
- Drinking fountains will be disabled. Students should bring their own water bottles and refill at designated water stations on campus.
- Bathrooms will be cleaned and stocked with soap throughout the day.
- Disinfecting wipes and/or disinfecting sprays will be provided in every classroom.





Safety Protocols

Handwashing Sanitation Stations will be around the campus








Restroom Policy

- Two students will be permitted to use the restroom at a time. If more than two students need to use the bathroom, they will have to wait outside until the other students have finished washing their hands before entering.
- Staff will monitor hallways outside of restrooms
- All bathrooms will be regularly sanitized daily.

Water Procedures

- All drinking fountains are closed for the safety of the students.
- Filling stations are open to fill a reusable water bottle.
- During class, students will step out into the hallway, remove their masks, drink and then place their mask on again and return into the classroom.

What if my child is sick?


- If your child is ill prior to the program starting for the day, they should stay home.
- If your child develops symptoms during program hours, YEP Program Leader will inform the office and someone will escort the student to our "Isolation Tent". The parent will be notified immediately to come and pick up the student.
- Symptoms may include allergies. We have no way of knowing what is caused by allergies and what are actual sickness symptoms





Symptoms and Positive Cases
