*Cristina Cantu-Enrollment Broker/Outreach for MAXIMUS-assists families getting enrolled with Texas Star, Texas Star Plus, and Texas Health Steps insurance. - Health Class requirements: Angela Borchardt, Counselor at the HS spoke about the Health class. The SHAC committee would like to make Health a requirement for graduation. As of now, Health is offered as an elective in 8th-12th grade and is counted as ½ credit. If a student takes Health in the 8th grade it does count as high school credit. Many students take Speech and pair with Health as both are one semester classes. Mrs. Borchardt suggested including Health in the Elective count. A student must have 27 credits of electives to graduate. The committee voted yes to having Health put in the elective count and a requirement for graduation. The committee will present and propose this to the school board at the March 8th board meeting.
