

Jill Breathitt, Chair and Dixie Knight, Co-Chair agreed to continue in these roles for the 2019-2020 term.

Follow-up on vaping: On the district website there is an article from the American Lung Association on how to talk to your child about vaping. Pending approval, it was suggested each teacher show a short video on vaping during roll call or WIN time. Videos would be age appropriate and educational. Discussed having older students do research on dangers of vaping and present reports to younger students, a poster contest for younger grades, and different disciplinary actions for vaping at school. There are several monitors available for purchase that detect moisture and chemicals and could be placed in the bathrooms and locker rooms.

HB496 Traumatic Injury Response Protocol- all schools will develop a protocol for employees to follow in the event of a traumatic injury, provide a "bleeding control station" and offer training to any staff who may be "reasonably expected" to use the bleeding control station. Officer Curtis has provided a trauma bag to each campus and "Stop the Bleed" training for employees will be provided.

Playground equipment safety concerns: The monkey bars are a frequent source of injury for our students. Broken bones and blisters to the hands (sometimes involving the entire palm of the hand) are the most common injuries. Dyer and Dodd both have monkey bars with little to no protective coating and no canopy to shield the sun.

Suggestions made:

*remove monkey bars and replace with updated playground equipment

*apply/reapply protective coating to metal bars-coating decreases the heat and provides some grip to bars. Reapply coating yearly or as needed.

*place canopy or sun shield over bars to decrease heat from the sun

Principal approval would be required. Vendor list obtained and will research equipment and costs.
