Guest speaker from THR Community Healthcare was scheduled to attend and discuss healthcare needs assessment in Krum and surrounding areas but was unable to attend.

Aim for Success program was presented at KMS and KHS. Program addressed bullying, suicide, self-harm, social media, sexting, and pornography. Results of student surveys from program were positive, with 83% reporting they had learned something new and enjoyed the presentation.

Anonymous Alerts is a new app available to students and parents and is active on the KISD website and available for download onto a Chrome book or cell phone. Allows user to report incidents of bullying, abuse, drug use, assault, etc and remain anonymous. Campus administrative staff receive alert, investigate report, and take action as needed.

Dangers of vaping-The FDA has launched "The Real Cost" campaign about the dangers and long term effects of vaping/tobacco use. Target audience is youth ages 12-17yrs old. 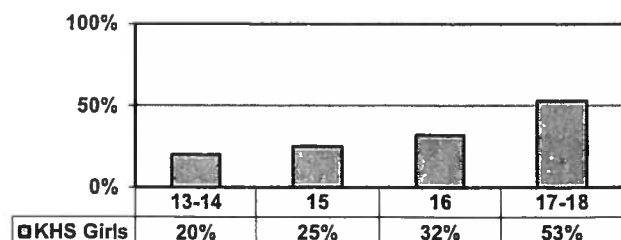
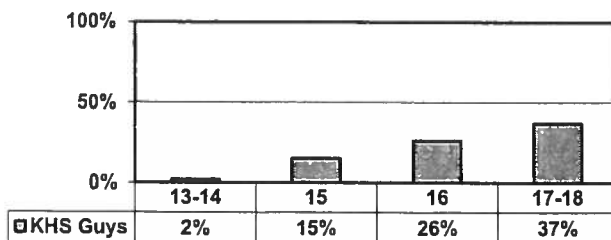
2. How would you rate the presentation?

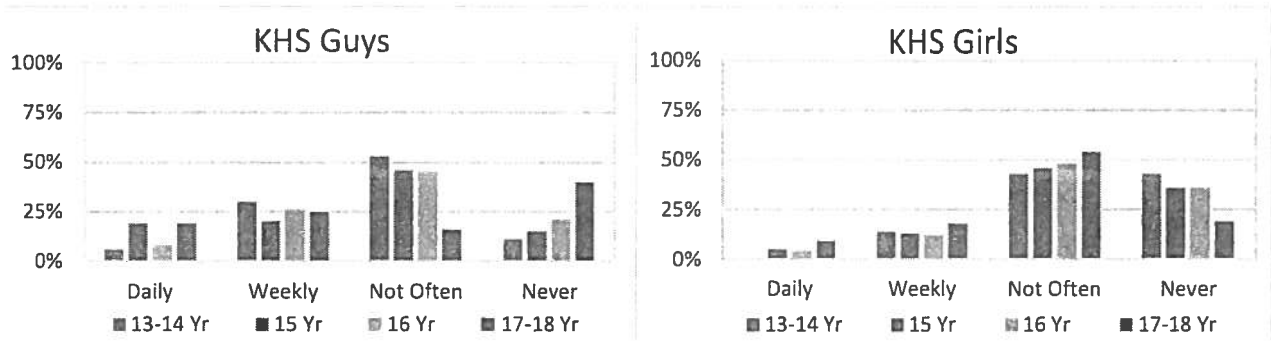
3. Have you ever received a nude or partially nude image?



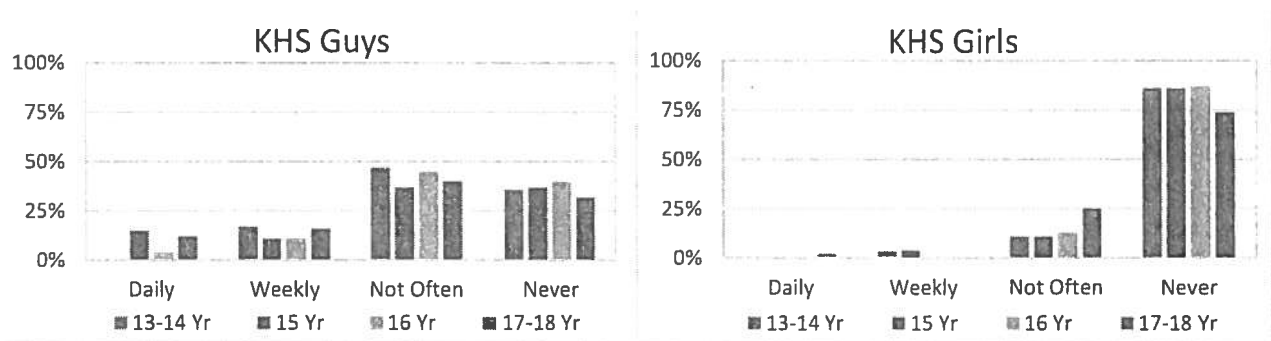
4. Have you ever sent a nude or partially nude image?

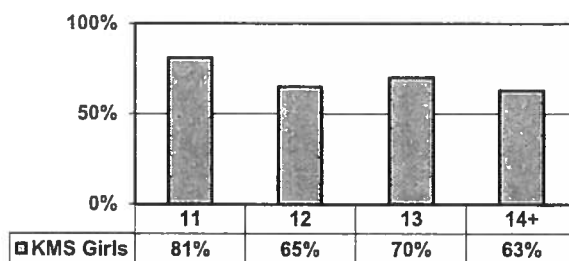
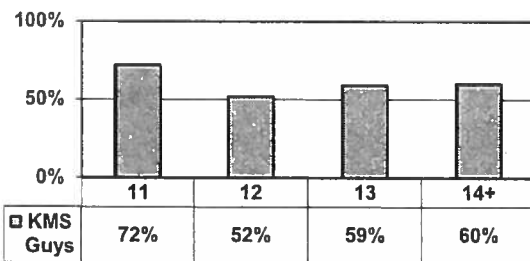

6-8th Abuse, bullying, relationships

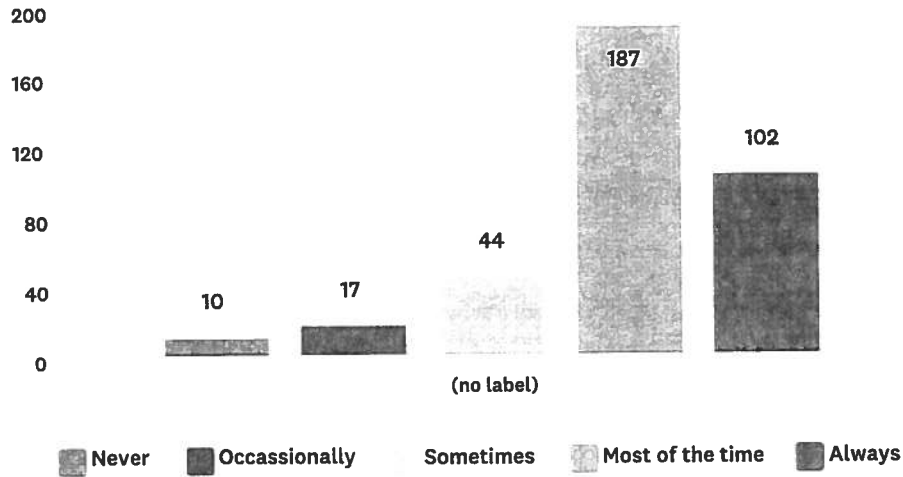
9-12th Dating Violence and Abuse

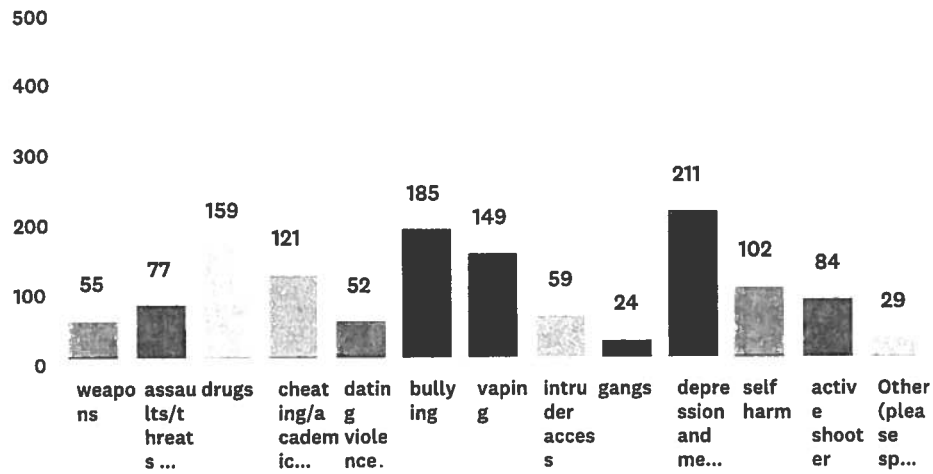

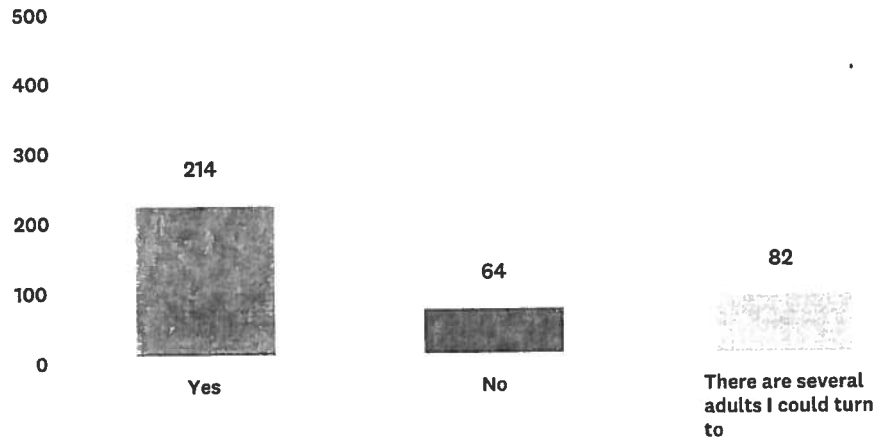

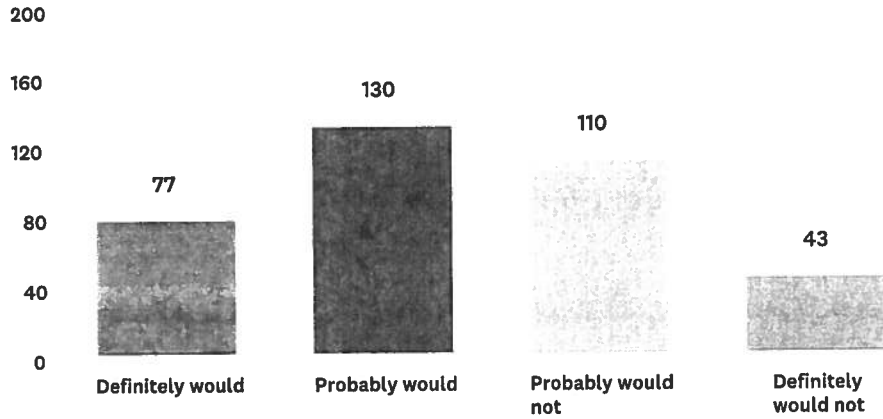

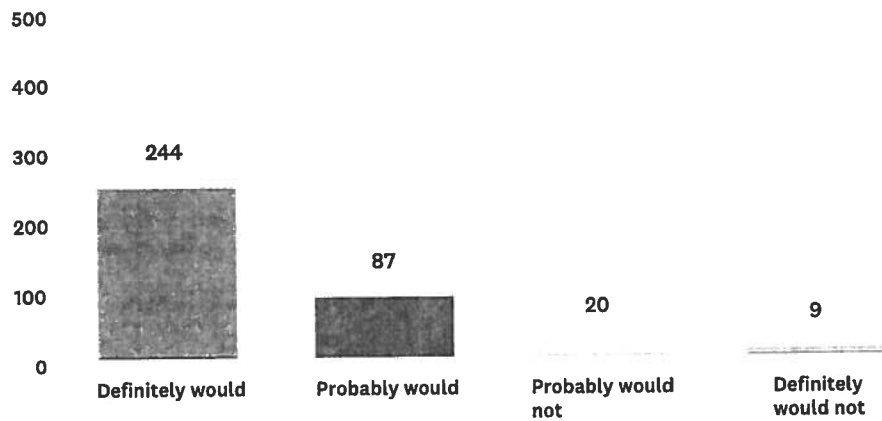

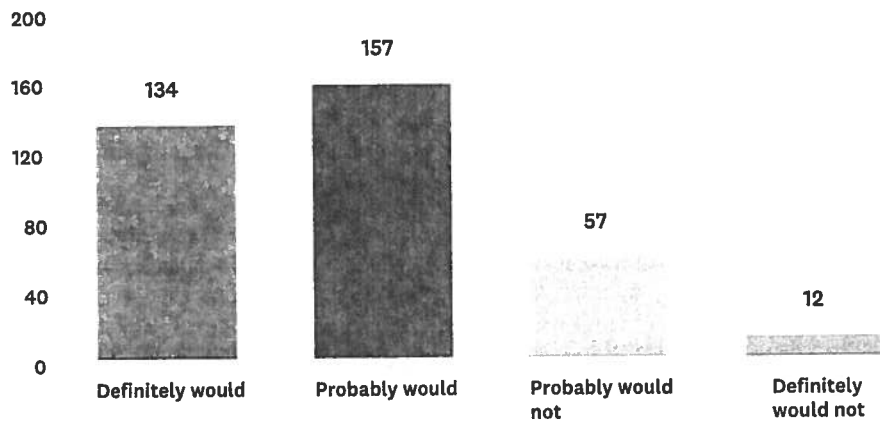

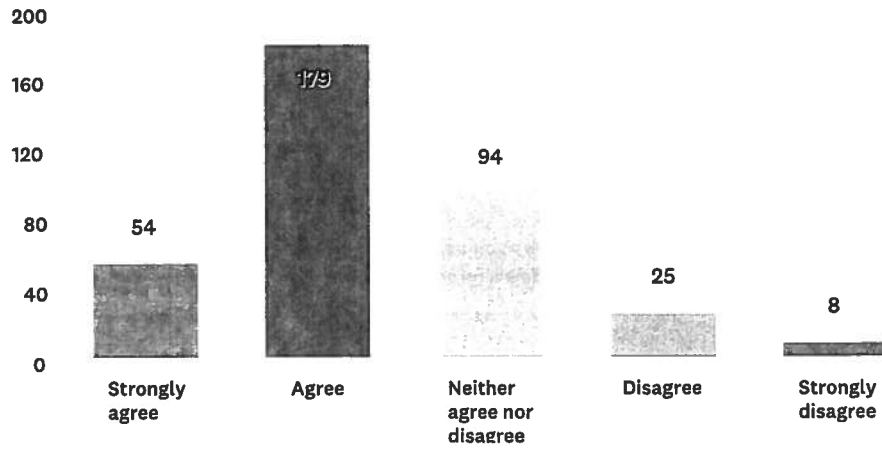

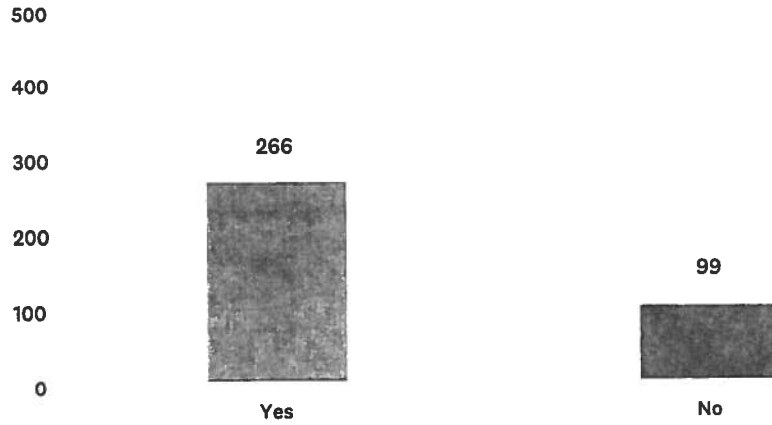

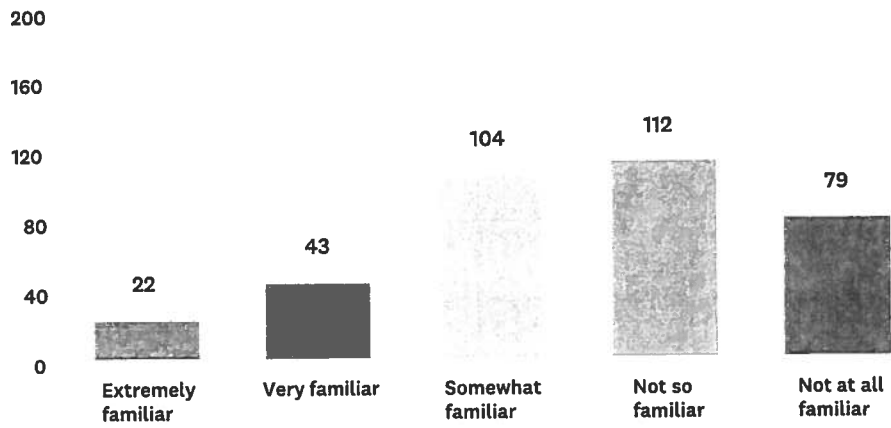

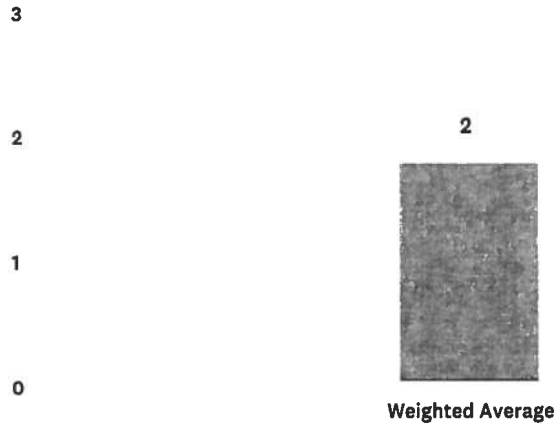

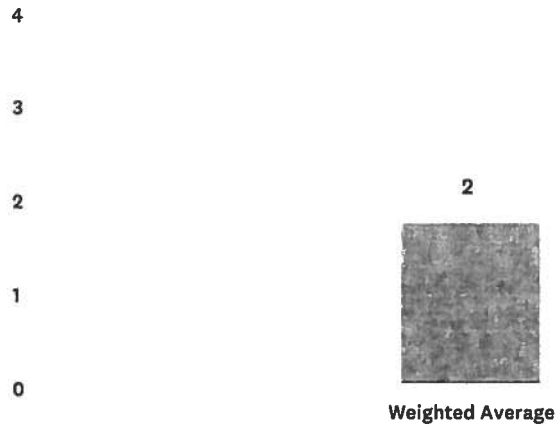

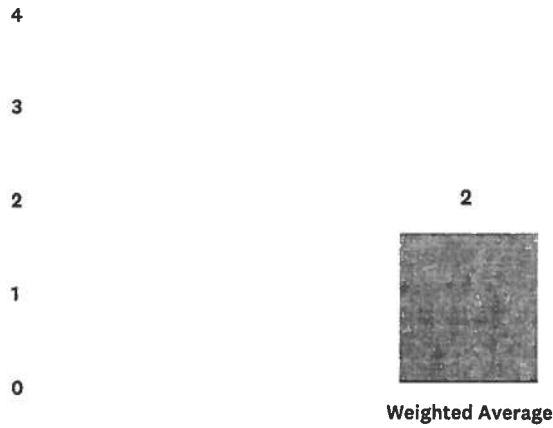

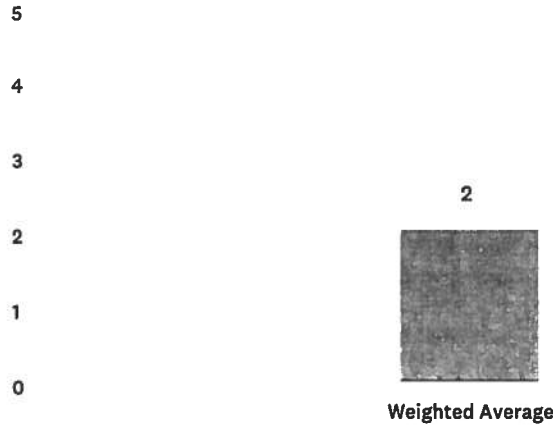

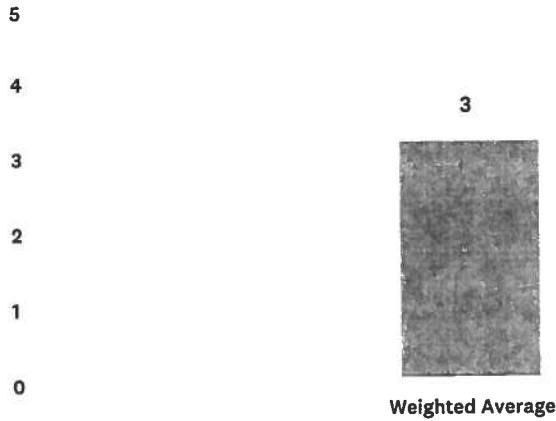
