August – September	<p><u>Unit 1: Vergil, <i>Aeneid</i>, Book I</u> (6 weeks) Required Latin reading: Vergil, <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 1, Lines 1-209, 418-440, 494-578 (Pharr). Required English reading: <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 1 (Fagles). Discussion themes: 1) Literary Style and Genre 2) Leadership 3) Human Beings and the Gods. Review: Vocabulary, grammar, stylistic features, dactylic hexameter, terminology.</p>
October	<p><u>Unit 2: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Books I & VI</u> (4 weeks) Required Latin reading: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 1, Chapters 1-7; Book 6, Chapters 13-20 (Mueller). Required English reading: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 1 (Handford). Themes: 1) Roman Values 2) Leadership 3) Views of Non-Romans. Review: Vocabulary, grammar, stylistic features, terminology.</p>
November	<p><u>Unit 3: Vergil, <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 2</u> (4 weeks) Required Latin reading: <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 2 lines 40-56, 201-249, 268-297, 559-620 (Pharr). Required English reading: <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 2 (Fagles). Themes: 1) War and Empire 2) History and Memory 3) Human Beings and the Gods. Additional practice: Sight reading poetry; writing an analytical essay.</p>
December	<p><u>Unit 4: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 4</u> (3 weeks) Required Latin reading: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 4, Chapters 24-35, and first sentence of Chapter 36 (Mueller). Themes: 1) Leadership 2) War and Empire 3) Views of Non-Romans. Additional practice: Sight reading prose; writing an analytical essay.</p>
January	<p><u>Unit 5: Vergil, <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 4</u> (3 weeks) Required Latin reading: <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 4 lines 160-218, 259-361, 659-705. (Pharr). Required English reading: <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 4 (Fagles). Themes: 1) Literary Style and Genre 2) Roman Values 3) Views of Non-Romans. Additional practice: Sight reading; writing an analytical essay.</p>
January- February	<p><u>Unit 6: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 5 – Part 1</u> (3 weeks) Required Latin reading: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 5, Chapters 24-37 (Mueller). Themes: 1) Literary Style and Genre 2) Roman Values 3) Leadership. Additional practice: Sight reading; writing an analytical essay.</p>
February – March	<p><u>Unit 7: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 5 – Part 2</u> (3 weeks) Required Latin reading: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Book 5, Chapters 38-48 (Mueller). Required English reading: Caesar, <i>De Bello Gallico</i>, Books 6 and 7 (Handford). Themes: 1) War and Empire 2) Leadership 3) History and Memory. Additional practice: Sight reading; writing an analytical essay. National Latin Exam.</p>
March – April	<p><u>Unit 8: Vergil, <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 6</u> (3 weeks) Required Latin reading: Vergil, <i>Aeneid</i>, Book 6, Lines 295-332, 394-425, 450-476, 847-899 (Pharr). Required English reading: <i>Aeneid</i>, Books 6, 8, and 12 (Fagles). Themes: 1) Literary Style and Genre 2) History and Memory 3) Human Beings and the Gods. Additional practice: Sight reading; writing an analytical essay.</p>
April – May	<p>Reread – Review – Practice (5 weeks) Reread & review Latin texts, complete required English readings; discussion topics, sight reading, practice exams. AP Latin Exam.</p>
