Dear Parents of the Class of 2023,

Congratulations, your son has entered the home stretch of his time at Roman Catholic High School. With less than two months remaining before graduation, I thought it was a good time to reach out to you and explain the grooming expectations for the graduation proceedings. All students are required to be neatly groomed at the ceremony. This includes being clean-shaven (no facial hair). While we are aware that this is a challenge for some of our students due to sensitive skin issues, we are notifying you at this early date in order to allow ample time for you to make an appointment to have your son shaved by a professional if necessary. Graduation gowns will be distributed on Thursday June 8, so please plan accordingly. No graduation attire will be awarded to any student who is not clean shaven.

In addition, students should have the hair styled in accordance with the school grooming policy which states: Recognizing that Roman seeks first and foremost to respect diversity, cultural and ethnic differences while acknowledging that the styles of young men change and are as unique as the young men who attend the school, all Roman students must be neatly and professionally groomed. Specifically, a student's hair must be clean, tapered, and above his eyebrows, ears and shirt collar. Students are expected to have natural hair colors. Sideburns must be neatly trimmed; must not flair and must not extend below the earlobe.

This week we were able to celebrate Crew's Varsity 4x who faced some of the strongest competition on the Schuylkill as well as across the country at Stotesbury and Scholastic Nationals. The quad consisting of Turner Coomes '24, Marco Ciervo '25, Alex Richards '23, and Charlie Miller '23, raced for a solid 2nd place at the Stotesbury Cup, and placed 4th overall at Scholastic Nationals wit competition from the Midwest as well as prominent teams both the East and West Coasts! The Quad had their medals blessed by Fr. Bongard this week in the Courtyard!



MOCK TRIAL

The past couple months have been an amazing experience for the eight students of the Varsity A Mock Trial Team. In mid-March, the team won the city title, the program's tenth in the past eleven years. At the end of March, these guys made Roman history by winning the school's first-ever mock trial state championship.

With that state championship, the team earned the opportunity to compete in the national mock trial championship in Little Rock, Arkansas during the weekend of May 18-19. The national case was released on April 1, and for the next month and a half, these competitors prepared openings, closings, direct and cross exams, and witness characters.

After a virtual scrimmage with the Minnesota team and an amazing send off by the school that recognized their achievements from the year, the team departed for Little Rock. During the competition, the team faced high-caliber teams from Florida, Montana, Indiana, and Texas. Of the 16 possible ballots, the A Team won eleven of them to earn the team's first national ranking. There are over 2,000 high school mock trial teams in the United States. Roman Catholic High School is now ranked 19th among those teams.

With so much talent rising from the program's other teams, the mock trial program looks forward to defending its state title next season and preparing for the world championship in October.



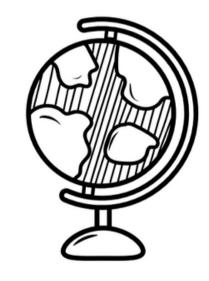
