DEFINITION:

Under general supervision, assists in the design and implementation of local and wide area networks (LAN/WANs); assists with research, testing and evaluation of network hardware and software; provides technical assistance to users in regard to network applications systems; and independently maintains and repairs networks. Ensures that copiers and security systems work daily

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Identifies, isolates, troubleshoots and resolves operational problems related to equipment, circuit failures, parts, network operations and LAN/WANs
- Researches and analyzes problems that are due to hardware, software, cabling system or operator error
- Installs and replaces network equipment and software
- Manages camera systems and network video recorders
- Monitors copier machines and provides maintenance
- Undertakes routine preventative measures and implements, maintains and monitors network security following department standards and established system configurations
- Documents records related to network installation, copier repairs, camera troubleshooting, and other trouble calls
- Confers with users regarding prospective needs for network requirements and services
- Tests hardware and transmission media
- Monitors systems to support and control network traffic
- Acts as a liaison between users, vendors and technology staff to resolve technical problems
- Closes Help Desk tickets
- Perform other related duties as required

KNOWLEDGE OF:

- LAN/WANs topologies, concepts/practices, hardware, software/application systems, terminology, protocols, Telco circuits, cabling, security principles, procedures and applications
- Security systems and video recorders
- Video projector installations
- Multifunction copy machines
- Digital test equipment and usage of hand tools
- Common symptoms associated with malfunctions of each network component, common diagnostics and trouble-shooting procedures
- Backup, restart and recovery procedures for network configurations
- Methodology/basic principles of physical installation including facility layouts, testing of data lines and equipment configuration
- Industry trends, concepts, practicality and impact on current network systems
- Safety practices and precautions
