Charles Cramer is a 1967 graduate of JHS. While at JHS, our male honoree was a 4 year member of the Fighting Owl football team, where he was a Team Captain his senior year as well as being named to the All-District and All- County teams. He was also a 4 year member of the Owls track program where he was a Team Captain his sophomore, junior and senior years. As a junior and senior, he was a State Qualifier in track,

finishing 2nd place each year in the 440 yard dash at the state meet in Austin, Texas.

After graduating from JHS, Dr. Cramer attended Stephen F. Austin University on a track scholarship. While at SFU, he was a Captain of the Track team all four years. He graduated with a BS degree in Biology and Chemistry and was in the top 10% of his class. He won the Shelton Award for athletics and academics in 1971. He was an All-American in 1968. His 440 relay team still holds the school record of 40.1. He was inducted into the SFU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996.

After SFU, Dr. Cramer attended the Baylor College of Medicine and graduated in the top 10% of his class. From there, he did his Internship and Residency at the University of Hawaii and became Board Certified in Internal Medicine. He did a Cardiology Fellowship for the Cleveland Clinic Foundation in Ohio and is now the Co-founder of Heart Place, the largest independent cardiology group in the United States, with their corporate offices in Dallas, Texas.
