Recommendation/Motion: Acknowledge the potential need to execute a change order to the general contract with Griggs Enterprises for a cost estimated to be as much as \$1,261,058 (One Million, Two Hundred Sixty-one Thousand, Fifty-eight Dollars), approve an increase by that amount to the project Contingency Funds and approve a revision to the current BG-1 Project Application for a total of \$24,909,747 (Twenty-four Million, Nine Hundred Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred Forty-seven Dollars)for the construction of the New Elementary School at Athens-Boonesboro Road, subject to the approval of the Kentucky Department of Education, District Facilities Branch, per the provisions of 702 KAR 4:160.

Background/Rationale: The construction of the new elementary school to be located on Athens-Boonesboro Road is listed as priority 2a.1 on FCPS's 2013 District Facility Plan. EOP Architects produced final Construction Documents for bidding describing the construction of a new building totaling approximately 80,000 SF to serve 750 students. The program is consistent with other recent FCPS elementary school projects. The construction started on April 1, 2018. Final completion is planned for August 2019. Two weeks into the work at the site the contractor found construction debris buried over a large portion of what will be the main parking lot and front lawn of the school. The design team, the contractor, and the project geotechnical engineer (employed by FCPS) immediately went to work to determine the extent of the debris and the effect this undesirable material would have on preparing foundation and pavements. The pre-purchase geotechnical and environmental surveys conducted on FCPS' behalf detected only minor surface debris, visible in a couple of small piles. There was no indication that the area of debris was as large as a football field or that the depth of the buried material extended down as much as ten feet below the surface. The removal of the debris down to 1.5' under lawns and 3' under pavements, provides a considerable cost reduction by limiting the work to only those unsatisfactory materials that are in direct conflict with permanent improvements, and sorting compactable building remnants from trash that can't be compacted to provide a stable subgrade even under lawns. The quantities of materials to be hauled off the site are drastically reduced. In order to keep the project on schedule, a Construction Change Directive has been issued to the contractor indicating that FCPS requires the work to continue, that the debris should be removed as it is encountered throughout the construction progress, and that payment will be made based on the actual material quantities as verified by the project geotechnical engineer.

PROPOSAL: Based on the review of alternate strategies, the FCPS staff and the design consultants recommend acceptance of the increase of the project Contingency Fund by \$1,261,058, and approval of a revision to the BG-1 Project Application for a total of \$25,113,861 (Twenty-five Million, One Hundred Thirteen Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-one Dollars). Upon the Board's approval, these documents

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will be submitted to the KDE District Facilities Branch for review and approval. Approval will allow the construction of the New Elementary School at the intersection of Athens-Boonesboro Road to continue on schedule without delay. Based on this recommendation, a revision to the BG-1 is required as follows:

Background/Rationale: The stadium was reconstructed in 2007 as part of the BSHS building replacement project. Due to normal life-cycle and wear-and-tear, the artificial turf field and track are now ready for replacement. The initial BG-1 Project Application for the construction, identifying the extent and cost of the work, was approved by the Board at its January 22, 2018 meeting. That action also approved Pearson & Peters Architects produced final Construction Documents for bidding describing the replacement of the artificial turf and running track. The project is planned to start November, 2018, and final completion is planned for June, 2019. On August 1, 2018, four (4) bidders submitted proposals on the base bid. The results of the bidding are as follows:

CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT is entered into this hs1st day of August, 2018, by and between the **BOARD OF EDUCATION OF FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY**, 701 East Main Street, Lexington, Kentucky 40502 ("Board") and **The Business & Educational Leadership Authority, P.O. Box 65098, Virginia Beach, VA 23467** ("Second Party").

A. <u>PARTIES</u>:

The Board of Education of Fayette County, Kentucky, **Bryan Station High School & Crawford Middle School Title I** has established the need to **motivational presentations for students and parents** and has determined that this need cannot be met by existing district staff.

The Business & Educational Leadership Authority provides motivational presentations for students and parents and has expertise or needed products as described herein.

B. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this contract is to improve the availability of **motivational workshops for the** students and parents of Bryan Station High School and Crawford Middle School.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises set out herein, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. The Second Party shall provide to the **Bryan Station High School/Crawford Middle** School as an independent contractor, services under the direction of James McMillian/Mike Jones, Principals.

2. The second party shall provide September 6th - 60 minute Freshman Student Presentation, 60 minute JAG Program Student Presentation, and 90 minute Parent Presentationat at BSHS. September 7th - 60 minute 6th grade Student Presentation, 60 minute - 7th grade Student Presentation, and 60 minute - 8th grade Student Presentation.

3. The Board agrees to pay the Second Party for the services/products provided in this contract the amount of \$33,000. Additional expenses to be reimbursed are **none**, with a total amount of this contract not exceeding \$33,000.

4. The Second Party shall provide to the Fayette County Board of Education an invoice for services rendered under this contract and any agreed upon expenses to be reimbursed. Unless otherwise stated, travel and per diem shall be reimbursed based upon the district's current travel policies.

5. The Second Party is not debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs under Executive Order 12549, "Debarment and Suspension."

6. This contract may be re-negotiated based upon, but not limited to, increases in services to participants. Any modifications shall be agreed to in writing and signed by both parties.

7. The staff providing services to the Board herein are employees of the Second Party and shall not represent to anyone that they are employees or agents of the Board.

8. Either party shall have the right to terminate this agreement at any time upon a fourteen (14) day written notice, either personally delivered or served by some form of return receipt mail evidencing delivery, to the other party.

Each of the parties agrees to comply with all applicable law concerning the performance 9. of the provisions of this contract.

The Second Party certifies that it shall not discriminate in any of the services performed 10. in connection with this contract or in any program or activity it operates on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, age, creed, political affiliation, marital status, sex, or disabling condition.

The Second Party certifies that it has read and will comply with the Family Education 11. Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99).

Pursuant to KRS § 160.380(7)(a), any contractor who works on school premises during 12. school hours must submit to a national and state criminal history background check by the Department of Kentucky State Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation and have a letter, provided by the individual, from the Cabinet for Health and Family Services ("CHFS") stating the contractor is clear to hire based on no finding of substantiated child abuse or neglect found through a background check of child abuse and neglect records maintained by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services. The required background checks and letter from CHFS must be submitted to the FCPS Human Resources Office prior to the beginning of work. Failure to comply with this statute will be considered a breach of contract and will subject the contract to cancellation without penalty.

KRS 45A.455 PROHIBITS CONFLICTS OF INTEREST, GRATUITIES, AND KICKBACKS TO 13. EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION IN CONNECTION WITH CONTRACTS FOR SUPPLIES OR SERVICES WHETHER SUCH GRATUITIES OR KICKBACKS ARE DIRECT OR INDIRECT. KRS 45A.990 PROVIDES SEVERE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE LAWS RELATING TO GRATUITIES OR KICKBACKS TO EMPLOYEES WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO SECURE A PUBLIC CONTRACT FOR SUPPLIES OR SERVICES.

If any section, paragraph, or clause of this contract shall be held invalid by any court of 14. competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of said section, paragraph, or clause shall not affect any remaining provisions herein.

This contract is deemed to be made under and shall be governed by and construed in 15. accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Venue for any legal action filed concerning this contract shall be Fayette County, 16. Kentucky.

This writing reflects the entire agreement between the parties. No change or 17. modification of this Agreement shall be valid or binding upon the parties hereto, nor shall any waiver of any terms or conditions hereof be deemed a waiver of such terms or conditions in the future, unless such change, modification or waiver shall be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

This agreement will be in effect from August 1, 2018, through September 7 18. , 2018, unless terminated by either party as defined in Paragraph 8. The agreement may be renewed annually based upon evaluation of the effectiveness of the agreement in meeting the goals set forth herein and funding availability.

Background/Rationale: The lawn south of the Jessie Clark Middle School building is the site of one of several known sinkholes in the neighborhood. While LFUCG considers this sinkhole an active component of the stormwater drainage system, the ground around it has continued to collapse in the last few years and a dangerous condition has developed. FCPS engaged a geotechnical engineer to study the subsurface geologic features and the problem will continue to grow unless mitigation steps are taken. A design to stabilize the collapsing mouth of the sinkhole has been completed by the engineer. Bids were advertised on July 3 and NO bidders responded by the July 11 due date. Pursuant to KRS 45A.375, when no bids have been received from responsive and responsible bidders, the local public agency may proceed with non-competitive negotiations in accordance with KRS 45A.380.

Based upon the non-competitive negotiation process, ABR Construction, Inc. submitted a base bid in the amount of \$64,795.00.


